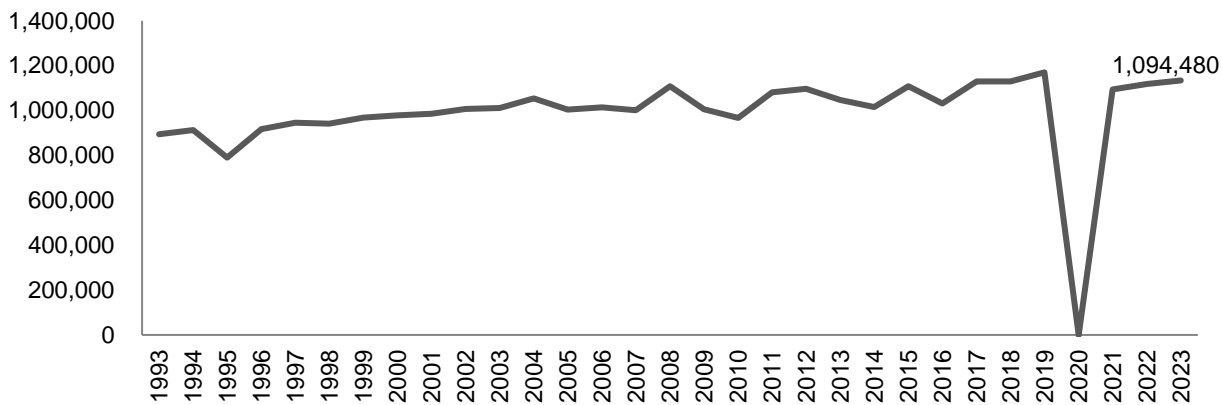

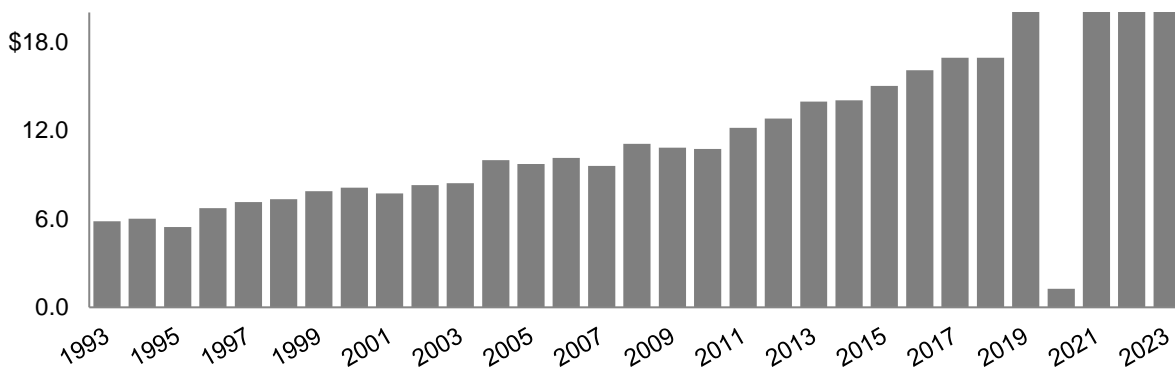

### Notes:

- 1) State Fair fiscal years run November 1 to October 31. State appropriations are reflected in the prior State Fair fiscal year.
- 2) Other revenue includes campground fees, attractions, commercial exhibitors, sales of promotional items, and miscellaneous sources.
- 3) In FY 2020, there was no annual Iowa State Fair due to the COVID-19 pandemic. A livestock show was held for three weekends in August in addition to other interim events.
- 4) In FY 2021, the State Fair received a \$1.9 million Paycheck Protection Program Loan and an \$8.2 million Shuttered Venue Operator Grant. This is included in Other Operating Revenues.
- 5) Vendor Sales are reported by vendors and include food, beer, and merchandise. The State Fair receives a varying percentage of vendor proceeds.
- 6) Special Fund revenues will be available after an annual audit.
