University of Northern Iowa — General Education

Purpose and History

Iowa has three public universities under the authority of the Iowa Board of Regents. Each university provides a broad array of programs and degrees while maintaining its own cultural heritage.

University of Northern Iowa (UNI) was formed as a normal school, a college for teacher preparation, and held its first class in 1876. While maintaining an emphasis on teacher training, the University has grown to nearly 12,000 students enrolled in more than 120 majors offered by 40 departments. The departments are organized into six colleges: Business Administration, Education, Humanities and Fine Arts, Natural Sciences, Social and Behavioral Sciences, and the Graduate College.

Funding

The General Assembly annually appropriates general education funding for the State universities to the Board of Regents, either in a specific amount for each university or in a lump sum appropriation to be allocated at the discretion of the Board.
