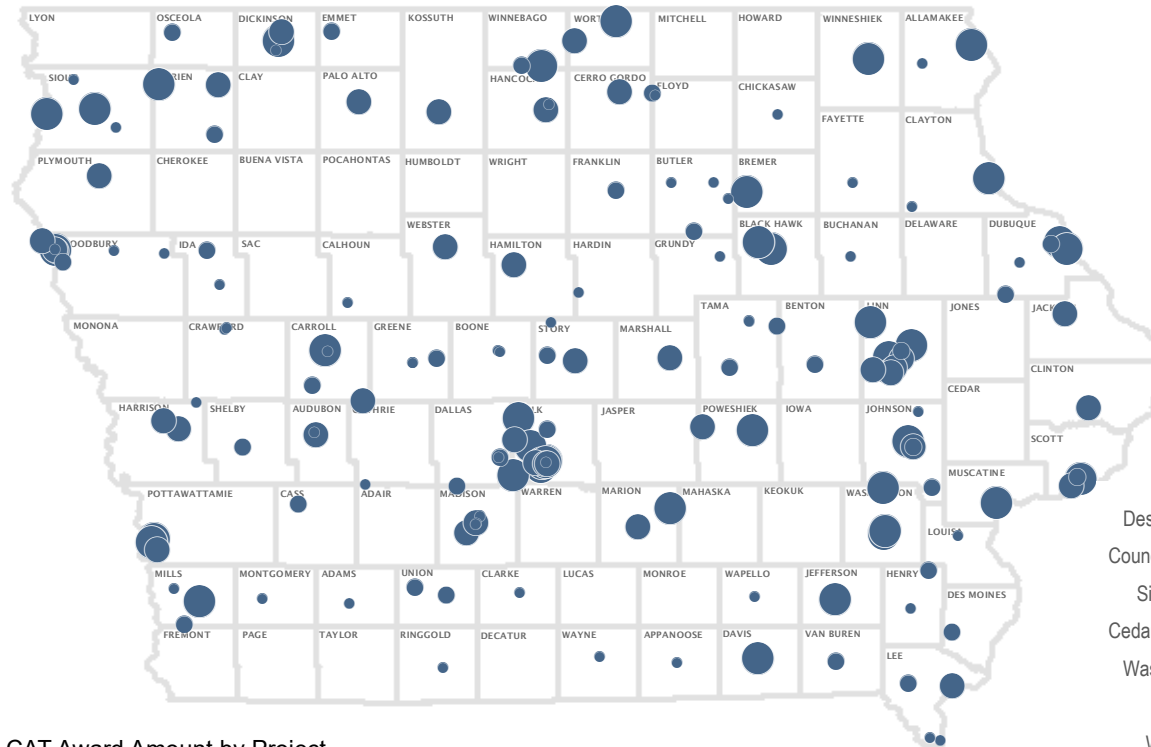


Community Attraction and Tourism Program — FY 2013-2022

The Community Attraction and Tourism (CAT) Program is the active grant program to support vertical infrastructure projects in Iowa, administered by the governor-appointed Enhance Iowa Board. Vision Iowa, River Enhancement Community Attraction and Tourism (RECAT), and Sports Tourism grant programs formerly administered by Enhance Iowa are no longer funded.

The CAT program provides financial assistance to communities in the development of multiple-purpose attraction and tourism facilities. Eligible CAT projects must be permanent recreational, cultural, educational or entertainment attractions; be available to the general public; and promote tourism in the local community. Eligible applicants include cities, counties, public organizations, or school districts in cooperation with a city or county. Applicants must have at least 65.0% of the project funding complete.



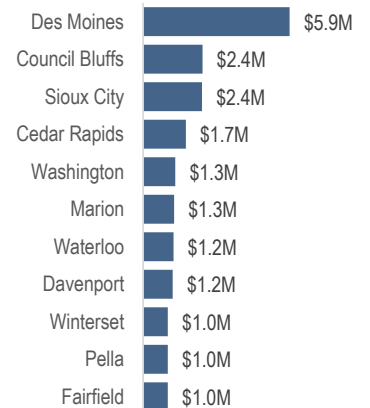

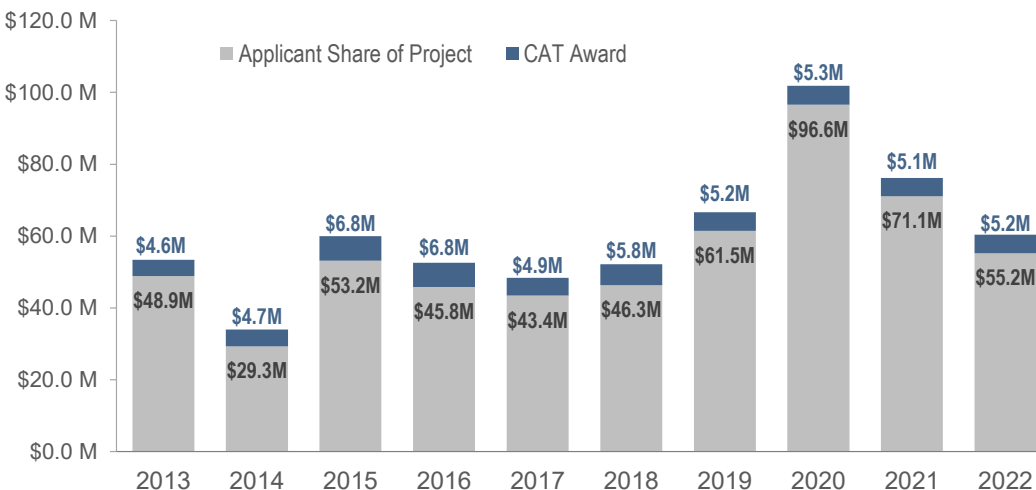
Top Award Totals by City
FY 2013-FY 2022



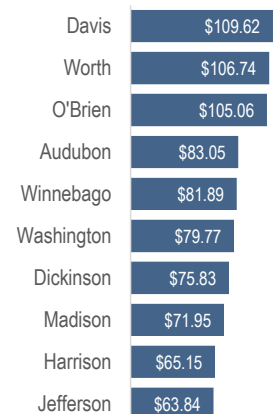
CAT Award Amount by Project
