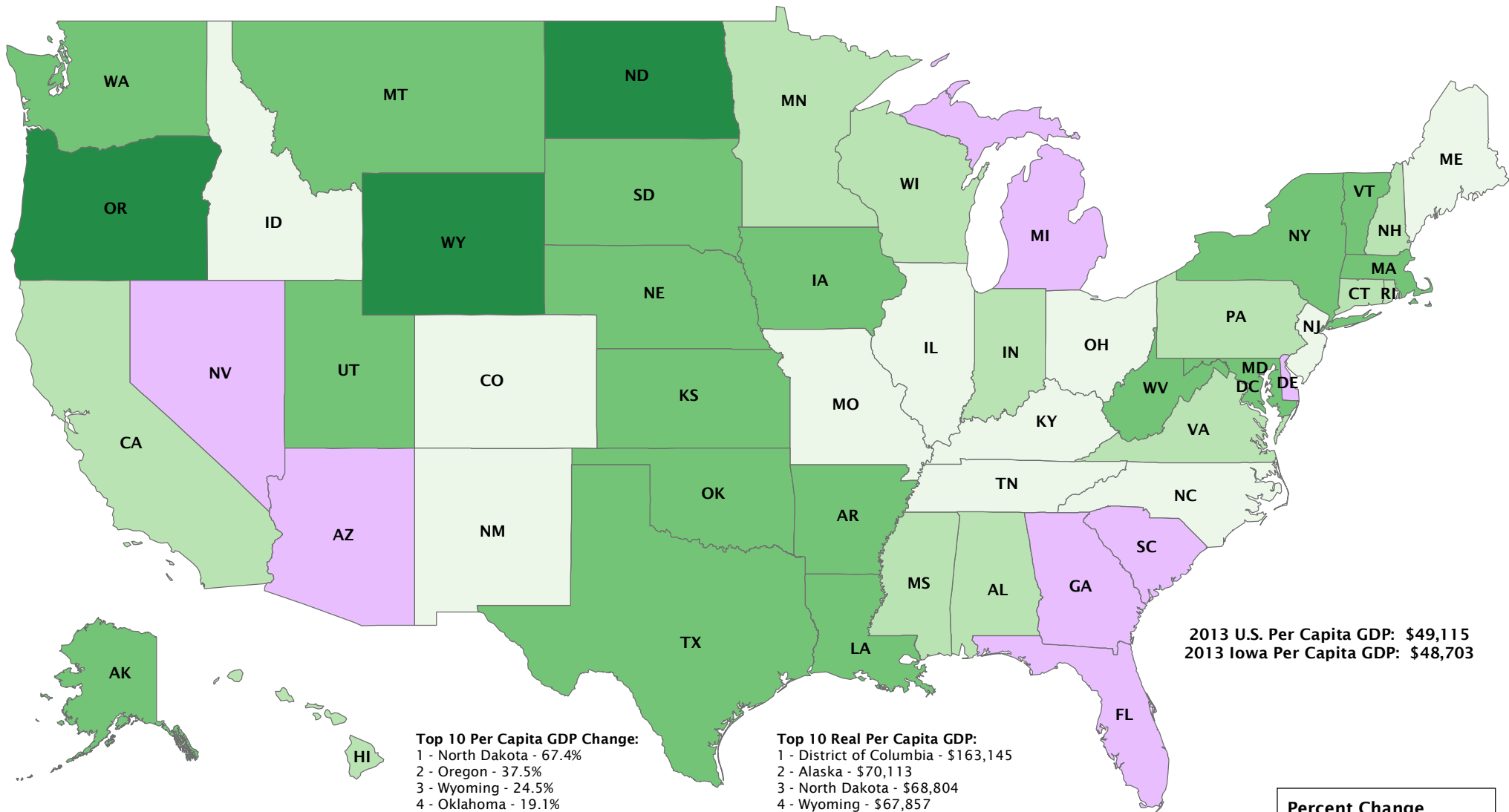


PERCENT CHANGE IN PER CAPITA REAL GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT

2008 - 2013



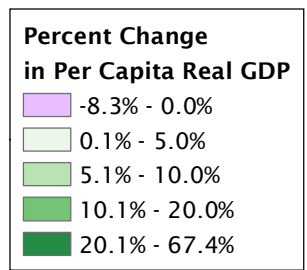

Note: Real Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is a macroeconomic measure of the value of economic output (goods and services) adjusted for price changes (i.e. inflation or deflation.) This adjustment transforms the money-value measure, nominal GDP, into an index for quantity of total output.
