ISSUED BY THE IOWA LEGISLATIVE SERVICE BUREAU

This summary of legislation has been prepared for the use of legislators and other interested persons. The classifications of legislative enactments under specific subject headings and the summary descriptions are the work product of legislative staff personnel. It is recognized that the legislative enactments contained herein may logically fall under more than one subject heading in certain instances and perhaps differences of opinion may arise as to the summary descriptions. However, it is believed that the purpose of this compilation--that of providing interested persons with a quick reference to legislation enacted in specific areas and generally informing them of the contents of the legislation--will be served by this publication.

This compilation contains only bills and resolutions approved by the Second Regular Session of the Sixty-fourth Iowa General Assembly meeting in the year 1972. A similar document is on file in the Legislative Service Bureau containing summaries for the 1971 legislative session.

AGRICULTURE

- S.F. 260 See County Government. Relates to establishment of a weather modification program.
- S.F. 392 By Committee on Agriculture. Provides for the licensing of dealers who engage in the business of buying, selling or exchanging swine for resale and their agents and for the regulation of swine movement in this state. The fee for a swine dealer's license is \$5 per year and for an agent's license is \$3 per year. The swine dealer must also be bonded for at least \$10,000. All swine moved in the state must be individually identified with an ear tag and each swine shipment must be accompanied by an official health certificate or veterinarian inspection certificate which is valid for a period of 72 hours. Swine may be moved intrastate directly to an approved auction market without identification or certification, but must be identified and certified at the auction market. Registered swine for exhibition or breeding may be identified by other methods approved by the State Department of Agriculture. The Act requires that the swine be quarantined at the farm of destination for 30 days. Swine having a contagious or communicable swine disease after delivery to livestock sale barn or auction market for resale must be returned to the consignor's premises and quarantined for 15 days. All swine which are destroyed because of infections or contagious diseases must be appraised by the State Department of Agriculture at their current market value, and the owner indemnified. The term "garbage" as it applies to feed for animals is amended to include the rumen content of slaughter cattle.
- S.F. 1019 By Committee on Judiciary. Corrects a possible constitutional defect in the original enactment of the Iowa Commercial feed law of 1964. The title of the original enactment did not mention that a penalty was provided for violations of the law. In addition, the maximum penalty for a first offense is reduced from \$150 to \$100. (Emergency: Effective
- S.F. 1200 By Committee on Agriculture. Provides for control of swine brucellosis by permitting the use of only one test of animals added to a validated brucellosis-free herd, and permitting the county levy for bovine brucellosis to be used for testing and inspection programs for control of swine brucellosis.

- H.F. 145           By Rex and Hansen. Authorizes a turkey checkoff of one-half cent for each turkey weighing less than ten pounds and one cent for each turkey weighing ten pounds or more. Referendum to be held to determine whether the checkoff will be imposed, upon petition of at least twenty-five turkey producers, and the proceeds derived from the checkoff to be used for development of the turkey market.
- H.F. 391           By Committee on Agriculture. Establishes licensing provisions for a dealer or broker, and his agents, engaged in the business of slaughtering animals or receiving or buying live animals for slaughter. The fee is \$25 for a dealer or broker and \$10 for an agent. A dealer or broker must furnish proof of financial responsibility in one of the forms stated in the Act. Licensing provisions are administered by the Department of Agriculture, and penalties for violation are provided.
- H.F. 1176          See Environmental Preservation. Relates to State Soil Conservation Committee.
- H.F. 1272          See Commerce. Relates to licensing of bonded agricultural warehouses.

APPROPRIATIONS

- S.F. 590 See Health. Relates to funds appropriated for renal disease programs.
- S.F. 593 By Committee on Appropriations. Appropriates \$500,000 to the Executive Council from the general fund of the state for the biennium beginning July 1, 1971, and ending June 30, 1973, to be paid by the Executive Council to an existing medical school for construction and equipping of a new medical school on land owned by the school within any county with a population of 200,000 or more.
- S.F. 1091 By Committee on Appropriations. Appropriates to the Department of Public Instruction for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 1972, \$575,000 for providing assistance to the school districts for breakfast, lunch, and minimal equipment programs to be used as state matching funds for federal programs. It requires all school districts to operate or provide for the operation of school lunch programs in all public schools for students who attend classes for four or more hours in each day. School districts may make such programs available to other students.
- S.F. 1182 By Committee on Appropriations. Appropriates \$100,000 to the Iowa Crime Commission for the purpose of obtaining federal matching funds, and creates a six-member legislative advisory committee for the commission, which may if funds permit include a post audit evaluation of programs.
- S.F. 1201 By Committee on Appropriations. Appropriates \$4,617,000 from the Primary Road Fund to the State Highway Commission for capital improvements at field operations facilities.
- S.F. 1203 See Military Affairs. Relates to appropriation for National Guard Armory--Hanger Complex.
- S.F. 1213 See State Government. Relates to reversion of funds appropriated to the Office of the Geological Survey.
- S.F. 1218 See Labor and Employment. Relates to appropriation for occupational safety and health regulation.
- H.F. 695 See Motor Vehicles. Relates to motor vehicle fuel refund warrants.
- H.F. 1001 See Conservation and Recreation. Relates to funds appropriated for inspection of amusement rides.
- H.F. 1099 See Taxation. Relates to appropriation for property appraisal manual and appraisers.

- H.F. 1213 By Committee on Appropriations. Appropriates \$8,000 for fiscal year beginning July 1, 1971 and \$17,000 for fiscal year beginning July 1, 1972 from the general fund of the state to the Secretary of State for establishing and funding a division of election in his office, which division was created in H.F. 1147.
- H.F. 1247 By Committee on Appropriations. Appropriates from the general fund of the state to the Educational Radio and Television Facility Board the following amounts: For the fiscal year commencing July 1, 1972; \$800,000 for extending state communications and educational radio and television to the northeast and northwest areas of the state, including \$25,000 for a translator for Mason City; for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 1973, \$800,000 for extending state communications and educational radio and television to the southwest area of the state; and for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 1974, \$800,000 for extending state communications and educational radio and television to the northwest central and northeast central areas of the state. \$10,000 is appropriated for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 1972 to be used as program acquisition costs to aid in making Sesame Street available to commercial television stations in areas which do not receive educational television.
- H.F. 1279 By Committee on Appropriations. Appropriates \$360,000 for purchase of the GMC Building, and adjacent parking lot, at East Seventh and Walnut.
- H.F. 1282 See Health. Relates to appropriation for physicians' assistants programs.
- H.F. 1291 See State Government. Relates to appropriation for office of citizen's aide.
- H.F. 1292 By Committee on Appropriations. Increases the annual allocation for construction of state institutional roads and state park roads from \$1,000,000 to \$1,400,000.
- H.F. 1299 By Committee on Appropriations. Appropriates \$60,000 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1972 to the Office for Planning and Programming for implementing the new state building code which was adopted by the Sixty-fourth General Assembly, Second Session, and is embodied in House File 6.

BANKS, SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATIONS, AND INSURANCE

- S.F. 1008. By Brownlee, Ollenburg and Carlson. Primary purpose of the Act is to place limitation of eight percent of total time and demand bank deposits any one bank holding company may acquire in Iowa, and to establish certain other requirements and restrictions relative to acquisitions and operations of bank holding companies. The bill also permits any bank in a metropolitan area of 50,000 or more population to place a prescribed number of offices in cities adjoining that in which the bank's home office is located, requires that the Superintendent of Banking approve any change of control of a bank in advance rather than merely receiving notice after the fact, permits banks to make loans secured by liens for periods not to exceed five years and for amounts not in excess of half the appraised value of real estate offered as security, and requires advance approval by the Superintendent of any arrangement involving payment by a bank of fees for management or financial services to any party having an interest in the bank.
- H.F. 1047 By Alt. Permits examination of service corporations formed by savings and loan associations, permits approval of consolidation of associations by a 51% vote, rather than a three-fourths vote of the members, and corrects a reference to the 40% of assets lending power of the associations.
- H.F. 1089 By Fischer of Grundy. Restricts the application of the Iowa Insurance Guaranty Association Act to nonlife and reciprocal or interinsurance exchanges licensed under chapter 515 and 520 of the Code. The law also provides procedures for the judicial review of orders issued by the Commissioner of Insurance under chapter 515B of the Code.
- H.F. 1117 By Committee on Commerce. Provides for the filing of the annual report of the Commissioner of Insurance on August 1 rather than May 1.
- H.F. 1141 By Ellsworth, Hansen, Sorg, Kennedy, Priebe, and Wirtz. Amends chapter 507B relating to insurance trade practices, by redefining unfair competition and unfair or deceptive acts or practices, and adding provisions relating to coercion of a debtor by use of a favored agent or insurer. Also gives the commissioner power to assess monetary penalties to an aggregate of \$10,000, and to suspend or revoke licenses of violators.

H.F. 1143

By Freeman. Increases the amortization period for loans made by state banks from five to fifteen years, and removes the ten thousand dollar limit for loans to any one customer.

CITIES

- S.F. 77 By Tapscott. Removes the requirement that any low rent housing project be approved at a referendum election. The municipality or low rent housing agency must first conduct a study or report on housing available in the community and make the report public. A public hearing must be held before the housing project is undertaken.
- S.F. 471 See Licensing and Fees. Relates to urban transit company vehicles.
- S.F. 1125 By Committee on Ways and Means. See Taxation. Relates to changing budget year of cities, counties, and other political subdivisions from calendar year to fiscal year.
- S.F. 1158 See Environmental Preservation. Relates to the issuance of revenue bonds by a municipality for pollution control facilities. (Emergency: Effective )
- S.F. 1198 By Committee on Ways and Means. Authorizes the extension of agreements between cities and towns to refrain from annexing specifically described territory for a period not to exceed ten years.
- H.F. 367 By Lawson. Allows public officeholders to be appointed members of joint planning commissions. The Act also allows joint planning commissions and councils of governments to be designated by the Governor as district, regional, or metropolitan agencies for comprehensive planning. (Emergency: Effective )
- H.F. 574 By Committee on Cities and Towns. Establishes the "City Code of Iowa" and repeals a large portion of Title XV of the Code. Sections 199 through 352 contain the repeals and amendments to bring scattered provisions of the Code in conformity with the home rule provisions of the bill. However, these repeals and amendments do not become effective for two years, so there will be a two-year transition period during which a city or town may continue to use present law or adopt Parts or Divisions of the City Code of Iowa. The City Code of Iowa, sections 1 through 198 of the home rule bill, is divided into nine Divisions. The first Division contains definitions, including the definition which eliminates the distinction between cities and towns, and general provisions such as publication, petition, and conflict of interest requirements. Division II describes the broad, home rule powers of

cities and sets out some of the limits on those powers. Division III provides a city development board to study and rule upon petitions and plans for incorporation, annexation and other boundary changes. The proposals are subject to election after approval by the board. The present optional forms of city government are retained in Division IV, and provision is made for a new form, under a home rule charter. Major powers and duties of the council and mayor in all cities are also listed. Division V gives some special procedures for city elections, and provides that general election laws are also applicable. Division VI describes legislative measures of a city, including ordinances, resolutions, motions, and the requirement for compilation of a city code at least every five years. New city financing provisions, and a city finance committee to supervise them, are included in Division VII. Provision is made for a capital improvements reserve fund. Cities will be required to gradually move to program-performance budgeting. New provisions are included for general obligation bonds, special assessments and special assessment bonds, revenue bonds, and contract letting. Division VII combines and simplifies present provisions relating to city utilities and utility boards, and Division IX consolidates over ten chapters of present law relating to various administrative agencies of a city, although provisions similar to present law for hospital boards of trustees and protection for existing library boards are included. (Effective July 1, 1974)

H.F. 1147      See Elections. Relates to precinct boundaries in cities.

H.F. 1257      By Committee on Ways and Means. Provides for the acquisition or disposition of air rights on urban renewal land and amends the law on general obligation bonds for urban renewal purposes. The law also clarifies the provisions relating to the allocation of tax proceeds from the increase in taxable value of an urban renewal project to pay bonds and other indebtedness authorized under Chapter 403 of the Code.

COMMERCE

S.F. 1013 By Committee on Commerce. Requires public utilities to pay interest to their customers on refunds paid to the customers for rate increases collected under bond by the public utility and which were later disapproved by the Iowa State Commerce Commission. The Commerce Commission is required to set the rate of interest which may range from 5% to 9% per year.

S.F. 1191 By Committee on Judiciary. Provides clarification of the circumstances under which a corporation would be allowed to use a name which is deceptively similar to another corporation. Provides that service of process may be made on any of a corporation's registered agents in the state. Provides additional circumstances under which a corporation might convert shares without par value into shares with par value. Provides that all the signatures on shares of a corporation may be facsimiles. Provides for a modification of shareholder's preemptive rights. Provides a redefinition of procedures for meetings of shareholders and allows participation in boards of directors meeting by telephone. Provides guidelines for allowing loans by a corporation to assist its directors. Provides for allowing facsimiles for signatures on bonds of indebtedness. Redefines procedures for amending the articles of incorporation. Provides for allowing mergers with corporations ninety percent of whose stock is owned by the merging corporation. Provides additional circumstances under which a court may liquidate the assets of a corporation in a suit by a shareholder. Provides circumstances under which a foreign corporation with a name deceptively similar to a domestic corporation or foreign corporation previously authorized to do business in Iowa, may itself be authorized to do business in Iowa.

H.F. 10 By Holden, Stromer, Fischer of Grundy, Cochran, Rex, Dougherty, and Winkelman. Permits the acquisition by purchase or condemnation of right-of-way by a county board of supervisors or the State Highway Commission for relocation, establishment, or improvement of a road. If access rights are acquired which lengthen an existing driveway from abutting property, the board of supervisors or Highway Commission must compensate the property owner for the property taken, but not for maintaining the additional length of the driveway or access. The board of supervisors or Commission may provide for the movement of buildings closer to the access, acquire all of the property, or pay the

property owner the sum of \$5.00 for each lineal foot of the additional length of the driveway.

H.F. 30

By Holden, Stromer, Priebe, Cochran, Rex, Rodgers, and Winkelman. Permits the county board of supervisors to request that the Iowa State Commerce Commission provide the services of a qualified inspector to inspect pipeline construction over land taken for a public use within the county. The costs of the inspection must be paid by the pipeline companies.

H.F. 254

By Shaw. Provides that a real estate investment trust, as defined in the Internal Revenue Code, may agree to pay a higher rate of interest than nine percent as domestic and foreign corporations may.

H.F. 1052

By Committee on Commerce. Eliminates special funds of the Iowa State Commerce Commission resulting from the collection of fees for regulation of certificated motor carriers. Truck operators, liquid transport carriers, interstate transportation carriers, and pipeline companies. The fees will continue to be collected but will be deposited in the general fund of the state. (Effective July 1, 1973)

H.F. 1272

By Committee on Commerce. Relates to licensing of bonded warehouses and permits the storage of agricultural commodities for which receipts have not been issued in licensed warehouses. Liability of a warehouse on a bond is limited to the face value of the bond.

CONSERVATION AND RECREATION

- S.F. 431 By Committee on Conservation and Recreation. Provides that the Conservation Commission shall establish the seasons, bag limits, possession limits and locality for seasons for the hunting of gray or fox squirrel, bobwhite, quail, jack or cottontail rabbit, duck, snipe, pheasant, geese, woodcock, coot, rail, ruffed grouse, wild turkey, and deer. The Commission also regulates the taking of migratory game birds under the "Migratory Bird Treaty Act" and the "Migratory Bird Stamp Hunting Act".
- S.F. 1014 By Robinson, Riley, and Potter. Allows the Linn County Board of Supervisors to advance from the county general fund to the Linn County Conservation Board up to 25% of the funds appropriated by the Linn County Board of Supervisors to the Conservation Board for the year 1972 only. (Effective: January 1, 1972)
- S.F. 1134 By Committee on Conservation and Recreation. Authorizes the Conservation Commission to establish, by rule, methods of taking trout from the state waters.
- S.F. 1172 By Committee on Conservation and Recreation. Transfers authority from the State Conservation Director to the State Conservation Commission for the regulation of state hatcheries and game farms, state game refuges and sanctuaries, and spawning grounds, and prescribes the purposes for which game refuges, sanctuaries, and spawning grounds may be established. Includes authority for the Commission to prohibit shooting at a reasonable distance from a state game refuge, and provides that the establishment of the refuge and the prohibition against shooting may be by posted notice. Also permits the director to establish temporary refuges, and describes purposes for which a game management area may be established by the Commission. Extends a penalty to any violation of chapter 109 or rules of the Commission.
- H.F. 680 By Committee on Conservation and Recreation. Clarifies existing statutes relating to law enforcement officers who are employed by the State Conservation Commission to enforce conservation laws. The Act removes the designations of conservation officers, boat inspectors, and water safety patrolmen and provides a uniform classification for these law enforcement officers under the merit system.

H.F. 711

By Committee on Conservation and Recreation. Requires the registration of privately-owned snowmobiles on a calendar year basis, which registration is in lieu of any personal property taxation, and requires the issuance of special registration permits to manufacturers and dealers for a fee of fifteen dollars annually. The noise level of snowmobiles is regulated. The maximum imprisonment for a violation of snowmobile laws is reduced from 90 days to 30 days and minor violators who would normally be subject to juvenile court proceedings under Chapter 232, are subject to prosecution under the chapter regulating snowmobiles. The State Conservation Commission is authorized to regulate all special events for snowmobiles in this state. The rental of snowmobiles is regulated concerning the maintenance of rental records and the equipping, use and operation of such vehicles. The operation of a snowmobile having an engine rating of 300 centimeters or more is limited to persons aged 12 years or more unless accompanied by an experienced adult.

H.F. 1001

By Committee on Human and Industrial Relations. Requires an annual safety inspection and regulation of amusement devices, rides, concession booths, and related electrical equipment at fairs and carnivals by the Commissioner of Labor under rules and regulations adopted by him after a public hearing. The annual permit fee for an operator is five dollars and the inspection fee for each amusement device or ride, concession booth, or related electrical equipment is established by the Commissioner of Labor to cover the cost of making the inspection, but not exceeding ten dollars per device, ride, booth or related electrical equipment inspected. An appropriation of \$37,000 is made to the Bureau of Labor to provide for initial expenses and an equal sum will revert to the General Fund on January 1, 1973, from the Amusement Inspection Fund. Each applicant for a permit to operate an amusement ride or device, concession booth, or related electrical equipment must furnish proof that he has obtained an insurance policy in an amount of not less than \$300,000 for bodily injury to or death of persons in any one accident (\$100,000 limit per person), and \$5,000 for injury to or destruction of property.

The Commission of Labor may order any unsafe or hazardous amusement ride or device, concession booth, or related equipment to cease operation until such time as the unsafe or hazardous condition is corrected.

Exempt from inspection and regulation by this Act are nonmechanized playground equipment unless a fee is charged for its use or to gain admission to location of such equipment, and concession booths or amusement equipment owned and operated by nonprofit religious, educational, or charitable organizations and located within a structure which is inspected by the State Fire Marshal or a political subdivision of this state. The Commissioner may also exempt amusement devices with self-contained wiring installed by the manufacturer and any playground equipment owned by any political subdivision of this state. (Emergency: Effective )

- H.F. 1015 See County Government. Relates to destruction of hunting, fishing, and trapping license records.
- H.F. 1038 By Clark. Repeals the prohibition against mental and physical endurance contests and repeals the penalty for participating in such contests.
- H.F. 1207 By Committee on Conservation and Recreation. Prohibits hunting of migratory waterfowl without a state stamp, which may be obtained for a fee of one dollar. The stamp revenues are to be used for conservation purposes relating to wetlands and waterfowl.
- H.F. 1219 By Committee on Conservation and Recreation. Authorizes the Conservation Commission to issue permits for the removal of undesirable or injurious fish from the inland waters of the state. The Commission shall determine the season, territorial limitations, method of taking, and the size limits for the removal of these fish.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

- S.J.R. 1008 By Conklin and Doderer. Ratifies the proposed amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which provides that equality of rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on account of sex.
- H.J.R. 2 By Holden. Proposes repealing the provisions of the Iowa Constitution which require that fine money and money paid for exemption from military duty be paid to the school districts. Present law requires that fine money be paid to the school districts. Passed the General Assembly for the first time.
- H.J.R. 8 By Ellsworth. Proposes amending the Iowa Constitution to repeal the prohibition against lotteries in Art. III, Sec. 28. The proposed amendment, having been approved by two sessions of the General Assembly, will be on the ballot in November, 1972.
- H.J.R. 1004 By Committee on Constitutional Amendments and Reapportionment. Proposes amending the Iowa Constitution to allow two-thirds of the members of each House of the General Assembly to convene the General Assembly in special session. Passed the General Assembly for the first time.

CORRECTIVE LEGISLATION

- S.F. 1087 By Committee on Judiciary. Clarifies the law to conform to the present procedures regarding the designation of general assemblies, numbering of chapters in session laws, and citation of session laws.
- S.F. 1132 By Committee on Judiciary. Corrects sections of the Iowa Code which are inaccurate or inconsistent with recent changes in the law, including sections relating to population of cities and towns, distribution of copies of the Code, budgets, legislative service bureau, sick leave and vacation for state employees, public safety department, notaries public, the board of architectural examiners, and references to the district court and the death penalty.
- S.F. 1169 By Committee on Ways and Means. Updates references to the Internal Revenue Code to include the Code as amended to January 1, 1972, for purposes of individual and corporate income taxes, and franchise taxes.
- H.F. 677 By Committee on Judiciary. Removes typographical errors in the section of the Code relating to the acquisition of sewage treatment plants and sanitary disposal projects.
- H.F. 1203 By Committee on Judiciary. Corrects incorrect references and references to repealed sections of the Code of Iowa.

COUNTY GOVERNMENT

- S.F. 260 By Briles. Provides for the creation of a weather modification board by the county board of supervisors if one hundred or more owners of agricultural property request it. The weather modification board may implement an artificial weather modification program and contract with public or private agencies to carry out the program. With the approval of the voters, a tax not to exceed two cents per acre on agricultural land may be levied.
- S.F. 1005 By Committee on County Government. See Taxation. Relates to free copies of public records to military personnel and dependents for perfecting claims.
- S.F. 1023 See Motor Vehicles. Relates to a county treasurer's share of motor vehicle registration fees.
- S.F. 1030 By Committee on County Government. Removes the requirement that the county assessor record all blind, deaf, and handicapped persons in the county to be forwarded to the secretary of the State Board of Regents.
- S.F. 1125 By Committee on Ways and Means. See Taxation. Relates to changing the budget year of cities, counties, and other political subdivisions from calendar year to fiscal year.
- S.F. 1190 See Social Services. Relates to establishment of county home liaison board.
- H.F. 69 By Schroeder, Logemann, Christensen, Kehe, Nielsen, Knoke, Schwieger, Camp, Tieden, Strothman, Schmeiser, Alt, Moffitt, Roorda, Pierson, Waugh, Strand, Mollett, Rex, Priebe, Cochran, Radl, Welden, Middleswart, Dougherty, Millen, Hamilton, Knoblauch, Winkelman, Stromer, and Holden. Creates a "county indemnification fund" in the State Treasury to be used to indemnify and pay on behalf of any county treasurer, recorder, auditor, attorney, clerk of court, sheriff, and engineer on matters relating to road and bridge design only, and any deputy or assistant in such county offices, all sums that such officers, deputies, assistants or employees are legally obligated to pay due to their negligent acts, errors or omissions. The first \$500 of each claim is not to be paid from the fund. The money for the fund is to be obtained from a two-hundredths mill property tax to be levied for three consecutive years in each county. The Act also authorizes the board of supervisors to purchase liability insurance to cover other county employees not covered by the

Act for their negligent acts, errors and omissions. The board of supervisors may also purchase blanket bonds in lieu of individual bonds to insure general liability or the fidelity of county officers or employees. The official bonds of all county officers required to be bonded is increased to \$10,000 per annum, except county treasurers whose bonds are increased to \$25,000 per annum.

- H.F. 544 See Military Affairs. Changes name of Soldiers Relief Commission.
- H.F. 1014 By Committee on County Government. Allows the county recorder to destroy chattel mortgages, conditional sales contracts, or other instruments or writing relating thereto, filed before July 4, 1966, ten years after the maturity date or any extension of the maturity date. The date of destruction is to be marked on the index record.
- H.F. 1015 By Committee on County Government. Allows the county recorder to destroy hunting, fishing, and trapping license records that have been held for five years or more.
- H.F. 1120 By Committee on County Government. Requires county assessors to notify real property owners by April first of each year in which an adjustment of the assessment of the real property occurs.
- H.F. 1129 By Committee on County Government. Limits the total annual mileage payment a member of the board of supervisors of a county with a population of 40,000 or less may receive to not more than \$1,000 per year.
- H.F. 1147 See Elections. Relates to establishment of county commissioners of elections.

COURTS AND JUDICIAL PROCEDURE

S.F. 202

By Committee on County Government. Revises the procedure for a legal change of name, removing the former prohibition against a name change by a married female, removing the prior residence requirement, and requiring petition to the court. Fees include a \$10 filing fee, \$2 copy fee, and \$1 fee for indexing the change of name in each county where the petitioner owns real property. Adoption of the new name by the spouse and minor children of the petitioner is optional.

S.F. 428

By Committee on Judiciary. Provides for one trial court in the state to be known as district court, presided over by district judges, district associate judges and judicial magistrates. Provides for removal of the limit on the number of district court judges in the state. Provides for the elimination of justice of the peace courts, mayors' courts and police courts, and the integration of the municipal courts into the unified system. Work of the minor courts will be taken over by judicial magistrates. Provides for part-time judicial magistrates and full-time judicial magistrates. Magistrates will be appointed by a county judicial magistrate appointing commission comprised of six people. Make up of this commission is one district judge, two lawyers selected by the county bar, and three by members appointed by the board of supervisors. Provides for a minimum of one judicial magistrate per county. If a county commission decides it would rather have two judicial magistrates rather than one, it can do so, but the total pay for the two can be no more than for one. Part-time magistrates will receive an annual salary of \$4,800 and full-time magistrates will receive \$17,200 annual salary. Part-time magistrates will serve two-year terms. Full-time magistrates will serve four-year terms. Present municipal court judges automatically become district associate judges with jurisdiction similar to full-time magistrates. Magistrates are subject to removal by the district judges sitting en banc and removal proceedings may be initiated by two percent of the electorate. Jurisdiction of magistrates includes nonindictable misdemeanors, preliminary hearings, search warrants, and small claims defined as cases involving \$1,000 or less. Full-time magistrates have jurisdiction of indictable misdemeanors. District associate judges stand for retention in office every six years starting in 1974. Provides for six-man jury trial before judicial magistrates. Provides for assimilation of present municipal clerks and bailiffs into district

court clerk's office and sheriff's office respectively. Provides for use of a police citation at discretion of police officer instead of taking an arrested person into custody. Provides for uniform state traffic citation and complaint. Provides for a uniform system of fines for certain violations and provides for payment of these fines by mail. Provides a court cost of five dollars except for overtime parking violations. Provides for appeals from judicial magistrate decisions to district judges on the record only. Appeal to the supreme court on nonindictable misdemeanors and small claims is by discretionary review only. (Effective July 1, 1973)

S.F. 1026 By Arbuckle. Extends the provision for place of bringing action in motor vehicle damage claims to all actions based on personal injury or property damage.

S.F. 1038 By Van Gilst. Provides for reinstatement of damages award by the courts in condemnation proceedings filed by the State Highway Commission on or subsequent to January 1, 1968 and where the suit was set aside because the property owner failed to serve notice of appeal to a lienholder when the court finds that the lienholder will not be damaged by the award of damages.

S.F. 1194 By Committee on Judiciary. Amends the Iowa Probate Code. Provides for service of notice without a prior court order and defines notice by mail. Increases the value of property a surviving spouse may take from \$15,000 to \$25,000. Provides for reinstatement of a prior will upon remarriage of a couple who were divorced or had their marriage dissolved. Provides equitable relief if a separate action is commenced against an estate when a claim against an estate could have been filed. Provides for the appointment of a guardian or conservator for a person incapable of caring for himself or his property. Allows the filing of a disclaimer in an intestate estate.

S.F. 1195 See Elections. Relates to drawing the list of grand jurors.

H.F. 556 By Shaw. Specifies that strict liability in tort is not applicable to the rendition of services under the uniform anatomical gift Act, but only a negligence standard of reasonable care is warranted.

EDUCATION

- S.F. 517 By Committee on Schools. Corrects terminology in a number of Code sections relating to school districts and school corporations, and provides that a school board member or his spouse may not be employed by the board.
- S.F. 593 See Appropriations. Appropriates funds to the Executive Council for medical school.
- S.F. 1059 By Gross. Provides for the deposit of 3/4 mill tax levied by merged areas to be placed in a special fund. Authorizes merged areas to borrow money in anticipation of tax collections and negotiate for loans. (Emergency: Effective )
- S.F. 1069 By Committee on Schools. Shortens the term of office of the county superintendent of a county or joint county school system from 3 years to 1 year. (Emergency: Effective March 16, 1972)
- S.F. 1070 By Committee on Schools. Establishes a committee composed of the Superintendent of Public Instruction, the Director of General Services, and the State Comptroller, or their designees, and two persons knowledgeable in the area of administrative-instructional computer systems to advise the State Board of Public Instruction in approving, coordinating, and supervising the use of electronic data processing computers by schools under the jurisdiction of the Department of Public Instruction. The Committee is required to recommend a state plan for the use of electronic data processing and submit recommendations to the General Assembly in 1972 and annually thereafter.
- S.F. 1091 See Appropriations. Relates to appropriations for breakfast, lunch, and minimal equipment programs for schools.
- S.F. 1136 See Military Affairs. Relates to payment of educational costs of children of prisoners of war or persons missing in action during the Viet Nam Conflict.
- H.J.R. 2 See Constitutional Amendments. Relates to distribution of fines to schools.
- H.F. 107 By Stokes and Dougherty. Allows school lunch facilities to be used by senior citizen organizations when authorized by the local school board and when such facilities are not being used for public school purposes. The local board may

charge the senior citizen organization for use of the facilities.

- H.F. 1032 By Pellett, Grassley, Waugh, Tieden, Stromer, Rodgers, and Radl. Allows school board members to resign effective with the new term of office for elected school officials, and individuals can run for that office and be elected at the regular election to fill the vacancy when the new term of office begins.
- H.F. 1045 By Lipsky. Changes the school budget certification date from July 15 to August 15 to correspond to local budget certification date of other political subdivisions.
- H.F. 1101 By Grassley. Legalizes changes in boundaries of merged areas which took place after January 1, 1969 and prior to January 1, 1972.
- H.F. 1127 See Liquor. Relates to consumption of alcoholic liquors and beer on public or private school property.
- H.F. 1247 See Appropriations. Relates to appropriations to Educational Radio and Television Board.
- H.F. 1253 By Committee on Social Services. Provides that university hospital ambulance services may be supplied to voluntary patients for a reasonable charge, if required equipment is not otherwise available and there is no interference with transportation of committed patients.
- H.F. 1269 By Committee on Schools. Makes several changes in the state school foundation program in chapter 165, Acts of the Sixty-fourth General Assembly, First Session. Corrects the definition of "fall enrollment", provides that shared-time reimbursement and additional federal aids are not included in miscellaneous income, and that all federal aids are to be excluded in 1973, requires budget amendments for 1971-1972 school year to be approved by the state appeal board, and makes other corrections.
- H.F. 1273 By Committee on Commerce. Subjects trade and vocational schools, except barber and cosmetology schools, to the law regulating the advertising and sale of courses of instruction, unless the school files a fifty thousand dollar bond or files a statement showing its net worth to be not less than five times the amount of the bond required. Penalty for violations is increased from \$100 to \$500 and from 30 days to 6 months in the county jail.

H.F. 1286

By Committee on Ways and Means. Exempts sales by authorized school districts of structures erected by students from the property value limitations set forth in section 297.22 of the Code. (Emergency: Effective )

ELECTIONS

S.F. 1195 By Committee on County Government. Previous law required that in drawing the list of grand jurors, not more than one shall be selected from any election precinct in the county. Since one county has only eleven election precincts so it is necessary to draw more than one grand juror from an election precinct, the new law provides that one or more persons may be drawn from any election precinct in the county, provided that at least one person shall be drawn from each election precinct.

H.F. 1147 By Committee on State Government. Revises the state election laws. The Secretary of State is designated as the State Commissioner of Elections and the state's chief election officer. The county auditor is designated as the county commissioner of elections and the county commissioner of registration. He is responsible for all voter registration within the county and for conducting all elections within the county, and the political subdivision calling the election shall pay all costs incurred in conducting the election. The voter residency requirements are changed from 6 months in the state, 60 days in the county, and 10 days in the precinct to 30 days in the state. The provisions for reprecincting of cities by cities is amended to allow the State Commissioner of Elections to establish the new precinct boundaries if the cities have failed to complete reprecincting within the statutory time limit and the cities are assessed for all costs incurred. New election precincts are also created in each county in which all absentee ballots are to be counted. The counting board is called the absentee ballot counting board. It is required that these boards be created for all general elections and discretionary upon the county commissioner of elections for all other elections. The new law also establishes an election expense fund in the office of each county treasurer. The county board of supervisors shall levy each year an amount sufficient to pay the costs of elections and voter registration. The funds deposited in this account cannot be used for any other purposes or transferred to any other county fund. (Emergency: Effective )

H.F. 1213 See Appropriations. Appropriates \$25,000 to Secretary of State to fund the division of elections in his office.

H.F. 1265 By Committee on State Government. Designates August 1 as the primary election date for 1972. Provides

for the reprecincting of cities not later than 40 days from the date of the Iowa Supreme Court reapportionment decision and allows counties 47 days from that date to redistrict. Requires filing of nomination petitions for elective county offices not later than June 9, 1972 and nomination petitions for candidates for United States Senator, Representative in Congress, state elective office, and member of the General Assembly to be filed not later than May 30, 1972. Proceedings of precinct caucuses, district conventions, and county conventions are legalized. (Emergency: )

ENVIRONMENTAL PRESERVATION

- S.F. 85 By Laverty, Erskine, Curran, Milligan, and Smith. Establishes a department of environmental quality to consolidate the administrative authority of the state relating to air quality, water quality, solid waste disposal, and chemical technology. Within the department are established three five-member commissions and one nine-member commission responsible for policy-making; an executive committee consisting of the chairman of the four commissions and six ex officio, nonvoting members, which establishes administrative policy for the internal operation of the department and coordinates the programs administered by the department, and the executive director, appointed by the governor, who is responsible for carrying out the policies, rules, regulations, and orders issued by the commissions. (Effective January 1, 1973)
- S.F. 1158 By Committee on Iowa Development. Adds pollution control facilities to the types of projects which a municipality may acquire by issuance of revenue bonds, and operate as a lessor under chapter 419, and provides that the Iowa Water Pollution Control Commission may contract with a municipality to pay that portion of the cost of a sewage treatment works project which the state must pay in order to obtain maximum federal assistance.
- H.F. 671 By Committee on Environmental Preservation. Gives authority to police to take abandoned motor vehicles into custody. After mailing of notice, the owner or lienholder has a fourteen-day reclaiming period. The abandonment may be on public or private property or in a garage. If not reclaimed, the motor vehicle may be sold at public auction for use or for junk. Also contains controls for demolishing vehicles. Abandonment of a motor vehicle is labeled a misdemeanor. Provides for transfer of title and restricted certificates for vehicles which are not fit for operation.
- H.F. 734 By Committee on Transportation. Cited as the "Iowa Junkyard Beautification and Billboard Control Act" this law was enacted to comply with Title 23, sections 131 and 136 of the United States Code and federal standards promulgated under Title 23. Junkyards within 1000 feet of the nearest right-of-way of any interstate or primary highway must be obscured from view from the main-traveled portion of the highway, excepting junkyards in industrial areas. Advertising devices shall not be erected or maintained within 660 feet of the right-of-way of

interstate or primary highways nor constructed beyond this limit in unincorporated areas which are visible from these highways, provided that advertising devices meeting lighting, spacing, and size requirements may be erected and maintained in zoned and unzoned industrial and commercial areas.

Excepted from control are:

1. Advertising devices advertising the sale of property on which they are located, or concerning activities conducted on the property.
2. Official directional traffic signs and devices.
3. Signs giving specific information to the traveling public.

The Act establishes a permit system for advertising devices not excepted from control and provides penalties for failure to comply with the provisions of the Act. Just compensation shall be paid to signowners, junkyard owners, and property owners for the removal of advertising devices which were lawfully erected and the screening or removal of junkyards which were lawfully established.

H.F. 1176

By Committee on Environmental Preservation.  
Clarifies voting authority of ex officio members of the State Soil Conservation Committee, allows State Soil Conservation Committee to set time limitations on soil conservation district commissioners to establish soil loss limits, and provides publication requirements for proposed regulations developed by soil conservation district commissioners.  
(Emergency: Effective )

GENERAL ASSEMBLY

- S.F. 203            Committee on County Government. Provides that state departments which have promulgated departmental rules which do not have an Advisory Opinion by the Attorney General, or which do not have the approval of the Departmental Rules Review Committee, have the burden of proof to establish that the rule is not arbitrary, illegal, or capricious. If the rule is found to be arbitrary, illegal, or capricious, the department or agency must pay the court costs and reasonable attorney fees.
- H.J.R. 1004        See Constitutional Amendments. Relates to General Assembly calling itself into special session.
- H.F. 1242           See State Government. Relates to establishment of a Compensation Commission.
- H.F. 1297           By Committee on Appropriations. Continues the legislative study of State Mental Health Institutes and the existing institutions for juveniles under the Department of Social Services and requires the study committee to report its recommendations to the Sixty-fifth General Assembly meeting in January, 1973.

HEALTH

- S.F. 334 By Committee on Agriculture. Regulates the sale of food and beverages through vending machines. The law requires the licensing of and provides for the inspection of vending machines and prohibits the sale through vending machines of adulterated or misbranded foods and beverages.
- S.F. 590 By Committee on Appropriations. Directs the Commissioner of Public Health to establish a program for the care and treatment of persons having chronic renal diseases. The Commissioner will be assisted in the development and administration of the program by an advisory board consisting of 11 members, including representatives of the medical professions involved in the treatment of kidney diseases and interested public members. The Commissioner, in consultation with the Advisory Board, will establish financial criteria for participation in the program, establish fees for the services under the program, lease dialysis machines to patients or to treatment centers, and provide training programs for patients and family in the use of dialysis machines. The appropriation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1972 is \$30,000.
- H.F. 219 By Committee on Social Services. Removes carbon tetrachloride appliances from the list of acceptable fire extinguishers for use in migrant labor camps.
- H.F. 1104 By Committee on Social Services. Requires the Department of Health to adopt standards and rules regarding impact resistant glass lenses.
- H.F. 1282 By Committee on Appropriations. Establishes a separate physicians' Assistants Fund to finance the physicians' assistants program and appropriates \$12,500 from the State Board of Medical Examiners Fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1972 to the Physicians' Assistants Fund, but the appropriated funds must be replaced. The Board of Medical Examiners in its report to the General Assembly on the physicians' assistants program is required to include a financial report of fees collected and money disbursed in order to determine a proper appropriation for the program.

LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT

- S.F. 274 By Riley. Prohibits age discrimination in employment.
- S.F. 470 See Retirement Programs. Relates to deferred compensation for public employees.
- S.F. 1148 By Committee on Human and Industrial Relations. Prohibits discrimination because of mental or physical disability in accommodations, services, or employment. An employer can offer employment to only the disabled if other applicants have available to them other employment which would not be available to the disabled. Every collective bargaining agreement must contain a section that the employer is not required to promote or transfer a handicapped person unless he is qualified for the job or occupation.
- S.F. 1206 By Committee on State Government. Authorizes the State Comptroller to establish a system of paying state employees which would provide for a bank to credit an employee's account with his net earnings on each payday without the issuance of a warrant.
- S.F. 1218 By Committee on Human and Industrial Relations. Provides a comprehensive law providing for the improvement of occupational safety and health in this state, patterned after the Federal Occupational Health and Safety Act of 1970. The Labor Commissioner is the state administrator. \$14,500 is appropriated for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 1972 and ending June 30, 1973, to be used to enforce the provisions of the law.
- H.F. 219 See Health. Relates to use of fire extinguishers in migratory labor camps.
- H.F. 1140 By Shaw, Lipsky, McElroy, Sargisson, Egenes, Franklin, Miller, and Mayberry. Establishes a statutory commission on the Status of Women with various duties relating to programs which will meet the changing needs and problems of women, and including a requirement to make an annual report to the General Assembly.

LAW ENFORCEMENT

- S.F. 1057 By Van Drie. Provides, retroactively to January 1, 1970, that the statute of limitations shall not run during the period of time that the identity of the defendant is unknown, in spite of diligent effort to discover it, in cases of personal injury or death resulting from a felony or indictable misdemeanor. (Emergency: Effective )
- S.F. 1182 See Appropriations. Relates to appropriation to the Iowa Crime Commission.
- H.F. 680 See Conservation and Recreation. Relates to law enforcement officers employed by Conservation Commission.
- H.F. 684 By Committee on Ways and Means. Transfers law enforcement functions relating to motor fuel taxes from the Department of Revenue to the State Highway Commission.
- H.F. 1273 See Education. Relates to regulation of trade and vocational schools.

LICENSING AND FEES

- S.F. 202 See Courts. Relates to fees for legally changing a person's name.
- S.F. 334 See Health. Relates to licensing vending machines.
- S.F. 392 See Agriculture. Relates to swine disease control.
- S.F. 471 By Committee on Transportation. Reduces the annual registration fee for each urban transit company vehicle from \$25 to \$5.
- S.F. 1171 By Committee on Agriculture. Transfers licensing of vehicles from which dairy products are sold from Chapter 192 of the Code to Chapter 170 of the Code and increases the licensing fee from \$3.00 to \$5.00.
- S.F. 1192 See State Government. Relates to licensing of pharmacists.
- H.F. 227 By Knoke. Increases the fee for issuance of a deed from 50 cents to \$3.00.
- H.F. 391 See Agriculture. Relates to licensing and bonding of slaughter houses and their agents.
- H.F. 1001 See Conservation and Recreation. Relates to fees for inspection of amusement rides and permit fees for operators of amusement rides.
- H.F. 1133 See Liquor. Relates to changes in alcoholic liquors permits and fees.

LIQUOR

H.F. 1082

By Lipsky and Christensen. Provides for the establishment of courses of education for persons convicted of operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of an alcoholic beverage. The course is designed to inform the offender about drinking and driving and encourage the offender to assess his drinking and driving behavior in order to select practical alternatives. The court may order a person convicted of OMVI to enroll, attend and successfully complete the course. An indefinite suspension of the persons' drivers license is ordered and continues until the course is successfully completed. Temporary driving permits are allowed.

H.F. 1127

By Logemann. Prohibits the possession and consumption of alcoholic liquors and beer on any public or private school property and permits the school's board of directors to adopt rules providing for the suspension or expulsion of students who violate the rule.

H.F. 1133

By Committee on State Government. Includes "intoxicating liquor" in the definition of "alcoholic liquor". It increases the terms of members of the Iowa Beer and Liquor Control Council by six months and allows certain special permit-holders to purchase alcohol directly from the distiller. It changes the qualifications of applicants for special liquor permits. It defines the authority of local issuing bodies upon initial issuance of liquor licenses and retail beer permits. It changes the license fees for hotels and motels located outside corporate limits of cities and towns and corrects the omission of the words "and tax" in provisions relating to air common carriers. It provides that certain refund provisions apply to all classes of retail beer permittees and provides notification of the transfer of location of the licensed premises for the retail sale of beer and liquor to the department and establishes a transfer fee by regulation. It redefines areas in which retail licenses and permits may be granted and redefines the term "grocery store". It eliminates a conflict in population factors in fees for retail beer permits and makes uniform the time a penalty of license suspension might last for all classes of beer permit holders and the holders of certificates of compliance by brewers and importers of malt beverages, and provides that books of accounts and records of beer permittees shall be open to inspection by the Division of Beer and Liquor Law Enforcement of the Department of Public Safety. (Emergency: Effective )

MILITARY AFFAIRS

- S.F. 1005 By Committee on County Government. Provides for free copies of public records to soldiers, sailors, marines, in service or honorably discharged, or their dependents, when necessary to perfect claims of such persons.
- S.F. 1136 By Rabedeaux. Provides for the payment by the state of educational costs, not otherwise paid by the federal government or another state, of children of prisoners of war or persons missing in action during the Viet Nam Conflict. The state will finance up to 36 months of study and the state's obligation may be terminated at such time as the parent is no longer imprisoned or classified as missing in action.
- S.F. 1203 By Committee on Appropriations. Appropriates \$128,260 to match federal funds for the construction of a new National Guard Armory-Hanger complex and provides for the development of a plan by the adjutant general for emergency helicopter ambulance services.
- H.F. 544 By Logemann. Changes name of County Soldiers Relief Commission to Commission on Veterans Affairs.

MOTOR VEHICLES

- S.F. 376 By Coleman and Kyhl. Provides that vehicles which are designed for a particular use, other than snow-mobiles, and for that reason do not meet the equipment requirements of chapter 321, may be specially registered and titled after inspection and certification by the Motor Vehicle Division of the Department of Public Safety.
- S.F. 1023 By Committee on County Government. Allows the county treasurer to deduct 75 cents from fees collected for the issuance of second half annual vehicle registration for trucks, truck tractors, road tractors, trailers, and semitrailers.
- H.F. 48 By Schroeder. Permits the movement of mobile homes exceeding 12' 5" in width and not exceeding 14' 5" in width on the highways of the state. Any mobile home exceeding 14' 5" in width is restricted to maximum trip distances set out in the law. A mobile home exceeding 12' 5" in width cannot be moved over any highways with a roadway width of less than 14' unless the mobile home is less than 14' 5" in width and is being moved to a terminous point. In this situation, the mobile home and the power unit are required to be under escort. Permits may also be issued to move a mobile home not exceeding 14' 5" in width over highways with a roadway width of less than 24' if the permit issuing authority determines that such movement is safe because of existing roadway characteristics and traffic density. The permit issuing authority may close the highway to any other traffic if traffic safety will be enhanced. The mobile home and power unit may also be up to eighty-five feet in length and be authorized to move unlimited distances on the highways. Vetoed by Governor.
- H.F. 671 See Environmental Preservation. Relates to abandoned motor vehicles.
- H.F. 695 By Committee on Appropriations. Appropriates \$20,000 for each year of the biennium from the motor vehicle fuel tax fund to the State Comptroller for employing personnel and defraying other expenses incurred in writing motor vehicle fuel refund warrants and maintaining proper records of the refunds.
- H.F. 1258 By Committee on Transportation. Extends from 15 to 30 days the time for repairing a vehicle which has failed to pass inspection, provides for appeal when a certificate of rejection has been issued, makes

vehicles which are transferred other than by sale subject to inspection, and extends from thirty to sixty days the time before the sale or transfer during which the vehicle must be inspected. Also makes a minor amendment to the list of tire equipment restrictions.

H.F. 1259

By Committee on Transportation. Extends time limit for displaying a "registration applied for" card on newly acquired motor vehicles from ten to twenty days to allow county treasurers additional time to issue permanent registration plates.

RETIREMENT PROGRAMS

S.F. 163

By Committee on Cities and Towns. Amends the definition of "average final compensation" for purposes of retirement systems for policemen and firemen, to provide that the five years of highest salary rather than the last five years of service will be used, and provides that a member of the system for fifteen years or more who terminates employment prior to retirement other than by death or disability and without withdrawing his accumulated contributions, may receive a proportionate amount of retirement benefits, but is not eligible for annual pension readjustment.

S.F. 470

By Doderer. Allows all public employees to defer a portion of their total compensation until after their retirement. It allows a public employee to select the type of plan he prefers and provides that it be administered in such a manner as to allow the State Comptroller to remit only one sum for the entire program.

ROADS AND HIGHWAYS

- S.F. 1201 See Appropriations. Appropriates \$4,617,000 to the State Highway Commission.
- H.F. 494 By Committee on County Government. Allows the board of supervisors of a county and the State Highway Commission to transfer jurisdiction over a portion of a highway by written agreement. The agreement may provide for improving the road by either or both parties, and the secondary road fund may be expended by the county and the primary road fund may be expended by the Highway Commission. If 100 persons petition that a hearing be held regarding the transfer, a hearing must be held and the board of supervisors and the Highway Commission must review their decision.
- H.F. 1292 See Appropriations. Relates to funds for construction of state institutional roads and state park roads.

SOCIAL SERVICES

- S.F. 185 By Miller, Briles, Thordsen, and Doderer. Combines the county fund for mental health and the state institution fund into a single fund called the county mental health and institutions fund, prescribes purposes and authorizes a levy for the fund, limits liability for support of a mentally ill person to the spouse, and if the person is under 21, to the parents, limits the amount of such liability, limits the amount which a board of supervisors may expend for treatment of mentally retarded persons in counties with less than 40,000 population, and reduces charge against the counties for delinquencies in reimbursing the state general fund from 1% to 3/4 of 1%.
- S.F. 1046 By Potgeter. Allows the Commissioner of Social Services, subject to the approval of the Executive Council, to grant the city of Eldora water and sewage easements so that the city may provide water and sewage service to the Eldora Training School for Boys; to grant sewage easements to the city of Marshalltown for sanitary sewer lines to the Iowa Soldiers' Home and to portions of Marshalltown; to grant easement rights for the drainage of waters through the grounds of the Women's Reformatory at Rockwell City; and to grant easement rights to the city of Cherokee for water and sewage lines to and through the Mental Health Institute. (Emergency: Effective March 15, 1972)
- S.F. 1190 By Committee on County Government. Establishes a county home liaison board to classify and certify county homes as health care facilities under chapter 135C, authorizes a levy of 1/4 mill but not to exceed \$20,000 for recreational or rehabilitative activities in county homes, and provides that old-age assistance may be paid to residents of a county-owned skilled nursing home.
- H.F. 217 By Den Herder, Radl, and Doyle. Separates the Board of Parole from the Department of Social Services and requires it to appoint an Executive Secretary and clerical staff including at least two liaison persons, and submit an estimate of funds needed to the State Comptroller. Also provides that a member of the Board of Parole, or its designee, and a representative of the Division of Corrections, must serve on the work release committee.
- H.F. 1016 By Camp and Lipsky. Allows the Iowa Soldiers Home to expend for general operating expenses the fees received from residents of the intensive care unit

of the Home and funds received on behalf of such residents from the federal government, for the remainder of the biennium only. (Emergency: Effective February 25, 1972)

H.F. 1042 By Kelly, McCormick, Schwieger, Christensen, and Doyle. Provides that time served on parole will count against the inmate's sentence if the parole is revoked, except time when the parolee is in violation of his parole.

H.F. 1104 By Committee on Social Services. See Health. Relates to impact resistant eye glass lens.

H.F. 1253 See Education. Relates to use of university hospital ambulances.

H.F. 1297 See General Assembly. Relates to legislative study of Department of Social Services institutions.

SPECIAL DISTRICTS

- S.F. 1125 By Committee on Ways and Means. See Taxation. Relates to changing budget year of cities, counties, and other political subdivisions from calendar year to fiscal year.
- H.F. 1012 By Committee on County Government. Requires that persons petitioning the county board of supervisors for the establishment of a rural water district must file a bond, certified check, or cash sufficient to pay all costs and expenses incurred if the rural water district is not finally established.
- H.F. 1036 By Committee on County Government. Requires the petitioners seeking the creation of a private sanitary district to post bond sufficient to pay costs of conducting an election to establish the district if the issue fails.
- H.F. 1084 By Committee on Agriculture. Exempts nonprofit rural water corporations from regulation by the Iowa State Commerce Commission.

STATE GOVERNMENT

- S.F. 1188 By Committee on Appropriations. Grants the State Archaeologist the authority for publication of scientific and educational reports.
- S.F. 1192 By Committee on Law Enforcement. Adds amphetamines and other stimulant drugs to the list of schedule II controlled substances under the uniform controlled substances Act, increases the fees for a license to practice pharmacy, makes the salary of the pharmacy board secretary subject to the merit employment law, amends the definition of "wholesaler" and "wholesale salesman" in the pharmacy and wholesale druggist chapter, provides for the period of practical experience required for a license to practice pharmacy to be a maximum of one year, and requires a pharmacy college to be accredited by the American council on pharmaceutical education. (Emergency: Effective )
- S.F. 1213 By Committee on Appropriations. Provides that \$21,000 of the funds appropriated to the Office of the Geological Survey will not revert to the general fund of the state at the end of the first fiscal year. This allows payment for projects which have been authorized, but not yet completed.
- H.F. 6 By Camp, Mayberry, and Lawson. Enabling legislation for the promulgation of a state building code. Code to be developed by a Building Code Commission and Advisory Council. Portion of code relating to factory-built structures shall apply statewide, while all other portions may be adopted by local governmental subdivisions. If adopted, the state code cannot be altered by a subdivision. The Building Code Commission may establish and collect fees to cover expenses of the office.
- H.F. 48 By Schroeder. See Motor Vehicles. Relates to movement of 14' 5" mobile homes.
- H.F. 412 By Welden, Hansen, and Kehe. Clarifies the difference between rules which must be submitted to the Departmental Rules Review Committee and internal rules of the department. It also grants the Departmental Rules Review Committee the authority to require departmental personnel to meet with it to discuss rules promulgated by the department and gives the Departmental Rules Review Committee the authority to render an advisory opinion to the department.
- H.F. 1011 By Committee on State Government. Lowers the age of majority from 21 years to 19 years. It increases

the age under which females must have the written consent of their parents to marry from 18 years to 19 years. For child welfare purposes a child is considered a child while he is in pursuance of a high school diploma or vocational training, even though he may be over eighteen years of age.

H.F. 1099 See Taxation. Relates to property appraisal manual and appraisers.

H.F. 1196 By Dunton, Alt, Sargisson, Hansen, Kruse, Taylor, Monroe, Andersen, Bennett, Clark, Edelen, Ellsworth, Gluba, Hill, Jesse, Kelly, Kremer, Larson, Logemann, McCormick, McElroy, Millen, Miller, Moffitt, Nystrom, Radl, Small, Sorg, Stanley, Uban, Waugh, Willits, Winkelman, Wirtz, and Drake. Provides for the use of Terrace Hill as the Governor's mansion and provides for preserving the first floor for official functions of the Governor and to be open to the public. The Executive Council may accept federal funds and private gifts for remodeling Terrace Hill. The Executive Council is required to submit a report to the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, First Session, on plans for the remodeling and conversion of Terrace Hill into the Governor's Mansion.

H.F. 1214 By Committee on Appropriations. Requires the State Comptroller to create a "salary adjustment fund" in which to deposit amounts which revert on July 1, 1972, from appropriations for salaries of state employees, in order to implement changes in merit system and executive council pay plans.

H.F. 1279 See Appropriations. Relates to purchase of GMC building.

H.F. 1242 By Committee on State Government. Establishes a commission to review and make recommendations relative to compensation and expenses paid to members of the General Assembly and salaries paid to other elective state officials and constitutional judicial officers.

H.F. 1291 By Committee on Appropriations. Creates the office of Citizen's Aide. Aide to be appointed by the Legislative Council, subject to the approval of the Senate and the House of Representatives. \$52,000 appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1972 and ending June 30, 1973, to implement the new law.

TAXATION

- S.F. 1059 See Education. Relates to taxes levied by merged areas.
- S.F. 1096 By Committee on Ways and Means. Authorizes the Director of Revenue to issue rules and regulations on tax exempt property and requires assessors to value and assess all tax exempt property and to annually file a list of all tax exempt property in his jurisdiction with the Department of Revenue. Assessors may revalue property annually and the abstracts are to be filed with the Department. Buildings erected by any person other than the owner of the real estate shall be assessed to the owner of the building as real property. Nonprofit public utilities are required to file a list of all property holdings annually. Assessment protests are to be filed by April 16 rather than May 1 which will allow the local board of review additional time to hear protests. Local boards of review are required to notify protestant of the board action on the protest not later than 15 days from the day of the board action on the protest. Equalizations orders shall be implemented in the year following the year of equalization.
- S.F. 1101 By Committee on Ways and Means. Provides that the full sales price or full consideration involved in each real estate transaction is subject to the real estate transfer tax.
- S.F. 1125 By Committee on Ways and Means. Changes the budget year of cities, counties, and other political subdivisions from a year beginning January 1 and ending December 31 to a year beginning July 1 and ending June 30. The budget year beginning January 1, 1973 is extending to last for 18 months. July 1, 1974 and each July 1 thereafter begins a new budget year. Provision is made for school districts presently operating on a budget year beginning on July 1 to borrow from the Permanent School Fund for funds needed during the transition period, since the second half property taxes will not be collected, and to repay the amount borrowed over a ten-year period. Assessment dates have not been changed. (Effective July 1, 1975)
