

Percent Change in the Number of Households in the Food Assistance Program by County — December 2014 - December 2018

Notes:

To receive food assistance, an individual must be a resident of lowa or a citizen or legally qualified noncitizen (such as a refugee) and have a household income that does not exceed 160.0% of the federal poverty level. For a family of three, that equals a gross annual income of approximately \$32,700.

The Food Assistance Program provides Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) cards that can be used to buy groceries at supermarkets, grocery stores, and some farmers markets.

In FY 2018, 81.0% of food assistance recipients also received Medicaid or Family Investment Program (FIP) benefits.
