


# Broadband Availability and Targeted Service Areas

The Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO) is required to determine broadband service availability by census block on a periodic basis. Broadband availability is reported by census block from service providers as required through the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) [Form 477](#) survey. Broadband is defined as 25 Mbps download and 3 Mbps upload speeds or better. A block is termed a **Targeted Service Area (TSA)** if it does not have broadband availability. Funding incentives are limited to TSAs. TSAs are current as of July 31, 2020.


