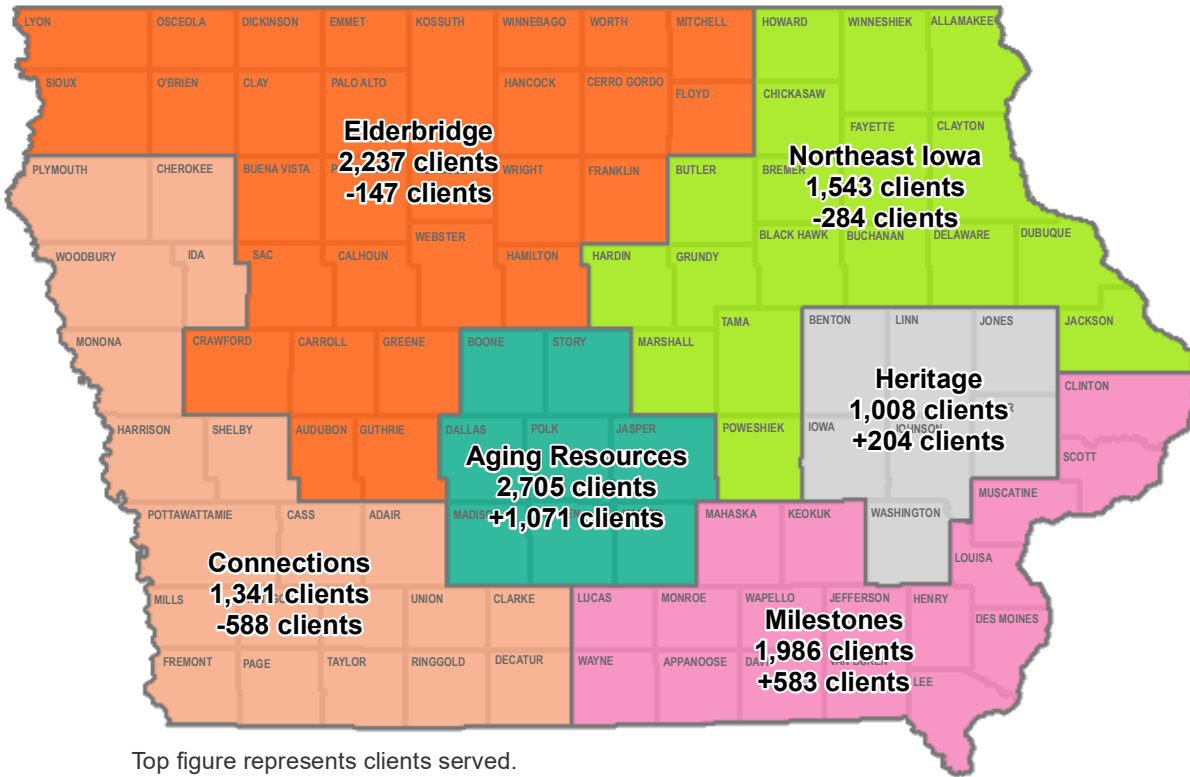


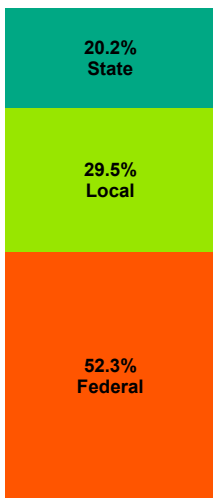
# Department on Aging Area Agencies on Aging — FY 2022
