Children's Mental Health School-Based Training and Support

Purpose

Governor Kim Reynolds established the Children's System State Board in April 2018 to develop and implement the State of Iowa Children's Mental Health System. The Board prepared a [strategic plan](#) and identified schools as a support to the system.

The area education agencies (AEAs) will be providing professional development including Youth Mental Health First Aid training, which is a nationally recognized curriculum. The curriculum teaches educators about risk factors and warning signs of mental health problems in students and promotes early intervention to support students who need assistance. Regional AEAs will use additional funding to meet the needs of the schools within their jurisdiction, including working with school-based teams, creating therapeutic classrooms, and reviewing the benefits of operationally sharing social workers.

Funding

[House File 758](#) (Education Appropriations Act), enacted during the 2019 Legislative Session, appropriated \$2.1 million for AEAs to provide mental health awareness training for educators and schools. The funds appropriated are to be used as follows:

- \$1.2 million for mental health awareness training for educators and schools.
- \$750,000 for identifying approaches to meet mental health needs of schools and strengthen community support for students.
- \$150,000 to create a clearinghouse of mental health resources for use by schools and community providers.
