Forfeited Property Fund

Purpose

The <u>Office of the Attorney General</u> administers the Forfeited Property Fund in compliance with Iowa Code section <u>809A.17</u> (Forfeiture Reform Act). Property subject to forfeiture is defined in Iowa Code section <u>809A.4</u>. Up to 10.0% of the gross sale of any forfeited real property or forfeited cash is retained by the Office and deposited in the Forfeited Property Fund. Cash forfeitures in excess of \$400,000 are distributed as follows: 45.0% is retained by the seizing agency, 45.0% is distributed among other law enforcement agencies within the region of the seizing agency, and 10.0% is retained by the Office of the Attorney General. Other seized property is governed by Iowa Code chapter <u>809A</u> and <u>administrative rules</u> of the Office of the Attorney General.

Funding

From FY 2014 through FY 2016, receipts to the Fund averaged approximately \$376,000 annually. Receipts vary from year to year, depending on criminal activity, investigations, and prosecutions. The year-end balance carries forward to the next fiscal year.

Expenditures from the Fund varied during the same period, with a high of approximately \$433,000 in FY 2016, and a low of \$10,250 in FY 2014. The majority of expenditures consisted of reimbursements to the Office of the Attorney General for enforcement of criminal law.
