Purpose and History

lowa has three public universities under the authority of the <u>lowa Board of Regents</u>. Each university provides a broad array of programs and degrees while maintaining its own cultural heritage.

<u>University of Iowa (UI)</u> was established in 1847 and is a major national research university with more than 30,000 students. The university offers more than 100 areas for both undergraduate and graduate study that range across the arts, sciences, and humanities, and it offers seven professional degrees. The areas of study are organized into 11 colleges: Liberal Arts and Sciences, Education, Engineering, Law, Nursing, Pharmacy, Dentistry, Public Health, the Henry B. Tippie College of Business, the Roy J. and Lucille A. Carver College of Medicine, and the Graduate College.

Funding

The General Education appropriation funds the University's primary educational functions. The UI receives approximately 35.0% of its funding from State General Fund appropriations, approximately 58.0% from tuition and fees, and the remainder from other sources.
