Attorney General - Federal Forfeiture Asset Sharing Fund

Purpose and History

The <u>Attorney General's Office</u> created the Federal Asset Sharing Fund in FY 2013. The Office has attorneys funded through the <u>High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area</u> (HIDTA) grant. The attorneys work with the U.S. Attorney's Office and U.S. Marshal's Service on certain federal drug cases. The Attorney General's Office is eligible to receive 5.0% of the cash value of the forfeiture related to the cases.

Funding

The Attorney General's Office received approximately \$15,600 in FY 2013 and approximately \$500 in FY 2014 in federal forfeiture funds. The funds have been used to upgrade information technology equipment and software in the Criminal Appeals and Area Prosecutions Divisions of the Office. The Office of the Attorney General reports annually to the U.S. Department of Justice and the Treasury regarding the receipt and disbursement of these funds.
