Iowa State University – Small Business Development Centers

Purpose and History

The <u>lowa State University</u> (ISU) Small Business Development Center budget is used to support the <u>Small Business Development</u> <u>Centers (SBDCs)</u>. The SBDC budget falls under the <u>ISU College of Business</u>. Established in 1981, the SBDC Program counsels and trains businesspeople in managing, financing, and operating small businesses, conducts market research, and provides comprehensive information services and access to experts in a variety of fields. The SBDC Center at ISU subcontracts with other universities, community colleges, and other institutions to provide a network of 16 regional assistance centers throughout Iowa.

Funding – State General Fund

The ISU SBDC budget receives an annual General Fund appropriation to support operations.

Other Sources of Revenue

The SBDC budget also receives an annual appropriation from the Skilled Worker and Job Creation Fund (SWJCF) in the Economic Development Appropriations Act. In addition, the Program operates with various levels of support from federal funds and other miscellaneous sources of income.
