Iowa Skilled Worker and Job Creation Fund

Purpose and History

In 2013, the 85th General Assembly enacted 2013 Iowa Acts, chapter [141](#) (FY 2014 Education Appropriations Act), which established the Iowa Skilled Worker and Job Creation Fund (SWJCF) in Iowa Code section [8.75](#). The Fund centralizes funding for job creation, job training, and job learning opportunities.

Section 30 of 2013 Iowa Acts, chapter [142](#) (FY 2014 Infrastructure Appropriations Act) amended Iowa Code to annually deposit \$66.0 million in State wagering tax receipts to the SWJCF beginning in FY 2014. Prior to this law change, the \$66.0 million was deposited into the Rebuild Iowa Infrastructure Fund (RIIF). The new funding replaced appropriations for job training-related programs that were previously funded from the General Fund (\$16.2 million) and the RIIF (\$15.0 million).

Section 30 of chapter 141 appropriated the \$66.0 million from the SWJCF for FY 2014 to multiple State agencies for various programs related to workforce training.

During the 2018 Legislative Session, \$10.0 million was deappropriated from the FY 2018 SWJCF appropriation to the High Quality Jobs Program and the \$10.0 million was transferred from the SWJCF to the General Fund in 2018 Iowa Acts, chapter [1028](#) (FY 2018 Budget Adjustment Act). In FY 2019, \$7.8 million was restored to the High Quality Jobs Program in 2018 Iowa Acts, chapter [1169](#) (FY 2019 Economic Development Appropriations Act). Chapter 1169 also changed the annual allocation of State wagering tax receipts to the SWJCF from \$66.0 million to \$63.8 million beginning with FY 2019.

Appropriations from the SWJCF occur in the annual Economic Development Appropriations Act and the Education Appropriations Act.
