

FY 2012 Performance of Duty Expenditures

The purpose of the Performance of Duty appropriation is to provide funding for emergency repairs to State property, if sufficient funds are not available in a State agency budget. The appropriation can also be used to fund a portion of the local match for local governmental entities where presidential disasters have been declared. All expenditures from the Performance of Duty appropriation must be approved by the Executive Council. The Performance of Duty appropriation is a standing unlimited appropriation from the State's Economic Emergency Fund. Standing unlimited status means there is no limit to the amount of expenses that can be approved by the Executive Council. Prior to FY 2012, the standing unlimited appropriation was funded through the General Fund, although other sources were occasionally used in place of the General Fund.

During FY 2012 a total of \$8.0 million was expended through the Performance of Duty appropriation. Of the total, 68.6% (\$5.5 million) was directed to the Homeland Security Emergency Management Division to cover costs associated with natural disasters dating back to 2007. The Department of Human Services (DHS) received 16.1% (\$1.3 million) of the appropriation, mostly for storm-related damage to the DHS facilities at various locations throughout the State. The Department of Natural Resources received 9.5% (\$768,000) of the appropriation for storm and fire-related damage at State parks. The remaining 5.7% (\$459,000) of the appropriated funds were allocated to other State agencies and entities for repairs to State property. The chart below shows how the appropriated funds were expended by State agency. The table on pages 2 and 3 provides additional detail on the expenditure of the FY 2012 funds.
