
Iowa Habitat and Access Program (IHAP) — 2021


The lowa Habitat and Access Program (IHAP) has significantly increased the amount of land available to hunters in lowa. Landowners receive funding and expertise for habitat improvements when they enroll in the program, and in turn allow public access to their land for hunting. IHAP qualifying properties must be at least 40 acres and be enrolled 3 to 10 years. Tracts are open from September 1 through May 31st. IHAP funding is provided in part by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA's) Farm Bill and State Habitat Stamp funds.

IHAP Acres by County


