What does it stand for?



What is 5-2-1-0?

- Nationally recognized and evidenced-based prevention framework to prevent childhood obesity.
- Goal is to increase physical activity and healthy eating for children from 0-18 through policy and environmental change.
- 5-2-1-0 message can be found in nearly every state and several countries.
- What makes it effective?
 - Simple message: 5-2-1-0
 - Backed by scientific evidence
 - Endorsed by multiple associations
 - Ties together multiple messages

The environments where kids live, learn, and play are changing



of Let's Go! sites have limited or eliminated sugary drinks and provide water instead.

Maine's childhood obesity rates are starting to decline for some grades



From 2015 to 2017, obesity decreased for third graders and trended down for fifth graders.

Healthy behaviors are increasing



Fruit and vegetable consumption is significantly higher among students at Let's Go! schools.





✓ Install sensory walks at 4 schools



5-2-1-0 Health Care Sites

- 2017- United Way of Central Iowa
 - Modeled after 5210 Let's Go! Health Care Program in Maine
 - 14 clinic sites in Central Iowa across 5 health systems
- 2018- Iowa Medical Society, United Way of Central Iowa, Kohl's Cares at Blank/Mercy
 - 4 IDPH Funded Communities + 8 clinics
 - 4+5 New IDPH Funded Communities + 1 IDPH Funded County + Additional clinics statewide
 - Currently >50 registered clinics
