## CHAPTER 31.

## LIST OF BLIND PERSONB.

AN ACT to Provide Information concerning the Blind.
March 22.
Seotion 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of lowa, That it shall be the duty of each muperlitendent. connty superintendent of common schools in this State to report on the first day of November of each year to the Superintendent of the Iowa institution for the blind, the name, age, residence, and poat-office address of every blind person and every person blind to such an extent as to be unable to acquire an education in the common schools and who resides in the connty in which he is superintendent.

## OHAPTER 32.

## DEAF AND DUMB ASYLUM.

AN ACT making further Appropriations for the Deaf and Dumb Marci 23. Asylum.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowoa, That Thomas Officer, Caleb Baldwin former comms. and G. M. Dodge, commissioners to superintend the doners continued erection of buildings for a Deaf and Dumb Asylum near Council Bluffs, with the Governor, who shall be ex-officio a commissioner, be and they are hereby continued as such commissioners.

Sco. 2. The said commissioners shall receive and thelr daty. disburse all moneys hereby appropriated for the completion of that part of said building authorized and provided for in chapter 107, Acts of the Twelfth General Assembly, approved April 7, 1868, and for the erection of the necessary ontbuildings, shops, and other necessary improvements. In case of vacancy in said board, caused vacanos. by death, resignation, or otherwise, the same shall be filled by an appointment by the Governor.

Sec. 3. That in addition to the sum heretofore appro-
$\$ 85,000$ appro priated, there is hereby appropriated the sum of thirty- Auditor of State.

Sec. 4. That all drafts drawn by said commissioners Auditing of upon the Anditor of State shall be andited and paid as other claims; provided, that no dratt upon the Auditor by said commissioners except the first one for work done Proviso. or material furnished, shall be andited and paid until the commiseioners shall have filed their vouchers with the Aaditor for all moneys disbursed by them.
Sec. 5. That no draft shall be made or money paid

No drafts except for work or ma. terial. out of the Treasary, except for work done or material furnished, and in making estimates by the saperintendent, it shall only be upon work done, material furnished, and actually upon the grounds, upon which said bnilding is being erected.

Sed. 6. This act being deemed of immediate impor-
Taking effect. tance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Daily Bugle and Daily Nonpareil, newspapers published in Council Bluffs in this State.

## CHAPTER 33.

OANAL IN POLK COUNTY AUTHORIZED.

AN ACT to Authorize Thomas Mitchell and others to cut a Canal across a Strip of Land, to straighten the Des Moines River.

Seotion 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa, That Thomas Mitchell, Erastus Smith,

Certain persons may cat canal acr 3 ss bend of $D$. M. River. in 881, tp. 78, r. 22. Joseph Caldwell, A. E. Person, John Owens, C. D. Person, and others, owners of land in section thirty-one, township seventy-eight, north of range trenty-two, west of the fitth principal meridian of Iowa, be and they are hereby authorized to cut a ditch, or canal across the bend of said Des Moines river in section thirty-one, township seventy-eight, north of range twenty-two west of the fifth principal meridian, so as to allow the river to ron across said bend through said ditch or canal.
