DRIVING OFF CATTLE.

APRIL 22. AN ACT to Prevent the Unlawful Driving of any Cattle or other Stock from the Premises of any Citizen of this State, or from their lawful Range.

Driving off stock three miles a misdemeanor. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa,* That any person who shall knowingly and willfully drive off, or cause to be driven off, any cattle or other stock, from the premises of any citizen of this State, or from the range in which the stock of any such citizen may lawfully run, to any distance exceeding three miles, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, on conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding thirty days.

Penalty.

Repealing clause. SEC. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

ASSESSMENT OF ROAD-BEDS.

APRIL 22. AN ACT to Provide for the Exemption of Land-owners to pay Taxes on Land which they have conveyed to Railroad Companies.

Lands used for railroad beds, not to be assessed to individuals. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa,* That, hereafter, no real estate in this State, used by railroad corporations for road-beds, shall be included in the assessment to individuals of the adjacent or contiguous property; but all such real estate shall be deemed to be the property of such companies for the purpose of taxation.
