SECTION I. Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of the Territory of Iowa, That each Each house to house of the legislative assembly shall have authority derly behavior to punish by fine and imprisonment every person not a member who shall be guilty of disrespect by any disorderly or contemptuous behavior in its presence, or who in any place where the legislative assembly is in session shall threaten harm to the body or estate And threats. of any of its members for any thing said or done in the assembly, or who shall assault or arrest any wit-Assault on ness or other person going or returning by order of witness, or either house, or who shall rescue any person arrested by order of either house of the assembly: and a majority of two thirds of either house may expel a Expel memmember of its own body: Provided always, That the bers. Council shall have cognizance only of offences committed as aforesaid against the Council; and the House of Representatives shall have cognizance only of offences as aforesaid against the House of Representatives: And provided, That the fine shall not exceed two hundred dollars and the imprisonment Not to exceed. shall not exceed forty-eight hours for any one offence.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That the mem-Privilege from arrest bers of the Council and House of Representatives shall be privileged from arrest, in all cases except treason, felony, and breach of the peace, during their attendance at the session of their respective houses, and in going to and returning from the same, and from being questioned in any other place for any And question.

SEC. 3. This act to take effect and be in full force from and after its passage.
