Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

SECTION 1. That all the ordinances of said town of Vail, passed by a legal majority of the council, and published, and not in contravention of the laws of the state, are hereby legalized, and hereby declared to be as valid and binding as though the requirements of the law had been strictly complied Legalized. with, and the said rule had been suspended by a three-fourths vote of the council, and the said ordinances had been signed by the mayor and recorder of the town.

SEC. 2. This act being deemed of immediate importance shall take effect from and after its publication in the Iowa State Publication. Leader, a newspaper published in Des Moines and the Vail Observer, a newspaper published in Vail, Iowa, without expense to the state.

CHAPTER 17.

CHANGING TERM OF OFFICE OF WARDEN OF PENITENTIARY.

AN ACT to Amend Section 4746 of the Code, Relative to Term of H. F. 389. Office of the Warden of the Penitentiary at Fort Madison.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

SECTION 1. That section 4746 of the code be amended by striking out the words, "from the date of his election" in the Termchauged. third line of said section, and insert in lieu thereof the words "from the first day of April following his election."
