CHAPTER 110.

COLLEGE FOR THE BLIND.

AN ACT Making Appropriations for the College for the Blind.

H. F. 460.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

\$8,500 appropriated. SECTION 1. That there is hereby appropriated for the college for the blind out of any funds not otherwise appropriated the following sums for the following purposes; to-wit: For repairing roof, the sum of twelve hundred dollars (\$1,200).

\$1,200 for roof.

For musical instruments the sum of three thousand dollars (\$3,000).

\$2,000 for music. For bedsteads, bedding and furniture the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000).

\$2,000 for furnishing.

For school apparatus the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500). For contingent expenses the sum of two thousand dollars

\$500 for apparatus. \$2,000 for contingent. Publication.

(\$2,000).

SEC. 2. This act being deemed of immediate importance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Iowa State Register and Iowa State Leader, newspapers published in Des Moines, Iowa.

CHAPTER 111.

DEAF AND DUMB.

H. F. 837. AN ACT Making Appropriations for the Institution for the Deaf and Dumb at Council Bluffs.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

\$60,100 appropriated.

SECTION 1. That there is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated for the institution for the deaf and dumb, the following sums for the purposes herein mentioned, to-wit:

\$8,000 for water.

For water supply eight thousand dollars (\$8,000).

\$1,000 for laundry. For laundry machinery and fixtures one thousand dollars (\$1,000.)

For a coal cellar and tunnel leading thereto five hundred dol- \$500 for coal lars (\$500).

For fire escape and porticos at the east and west wings of \$1,500 for fire said institution one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.) to to be expended be expended under the supervision of R. S. For tools and machinery for the carpenter shop and addi-\$500 for tools, tional printing outfit, eight hundred dollars (\$800) for the carpenter shop and five hundred dollars (\$500) for printing office. \$500 for printing office.

For the erection of a school building forty thousand dollars \$40,000 for school build-

(\$40,000.)

For repairs and improvement of the grounds, five hundred \$500 for dollars (\$500) and any unexpended balance now in the hands of grounds. the trustees.

For cold storage house, one thousand eight hundred dollars \$1.800 for cold (\$1,800).

For the purchase of land, five thousand five hundred dollars \$5,500 for land. (\$5,500).

SEC. 2. The money herein appropriated, shall be drawn and Moneys expaid out on the order of the trustees of said institution, at such der of trustees. times as may be deemed necessary by said trustees: provided, Proviso, that any money remaining unexpended after completion of the Unexpended improvement for which the same is herein appropriated, may balances, be used as far as necessary, for any of the purposes specified in this act, subject to the approval of the executive council.
