said, "The Mason City Cemetery Association," on and since the 11th day of May 1877, are hereby declared to be legal and valid in all respects, and the State of Iowa does hereby relinquish to said corporation, all right and title which she now has or might acquire by escheat, in and to any of the real estate above described.

(SEC. 2.) This act being considered of immediate impor- Publication. tance shall take effect from and after its publication in the "Iowa State Register," a newpaper published at Des Moinies Iowa, and the "Mason City Express," published at Mason City, Iowa, without expense to the State.

CHAPTER 7.

LEGALIZING INCORPORATION OF TOWN OF LITTLE SIOUX.

AN ACT to Legalize the Incorporation of the Town of Little Sioux, H. F. 82. Harrison County, Iowa, the Election of its Officers and all Acts Done, and Ordinances Passed by the Council of said Town.

WHEREAS, Doubts have arisen as to the legality of the incor- Preamble. poration of the town of Little Sioux, Harrison county, Iowa, the election of its officers, and the ordinances passed by the council of said town, therefore

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

SECTION 1. That the incorporation of said town of Little Legalized. Sioux, Harrison county, Iowa, the election of its officers, and all the official acts done and ordinances passed by the council of said town, not in contravention with the laws of the State, are hereby legalized, and the same are hereby declared to be valid and binding, the same as though the law had in all respects been strictly complied with in the incorporation of said town, election of its officers and the passing of its ordinances.

SEC. 2. This act being deemed of immediate importance, Publication. shall be in force and take effect from and after its publication in the Des Moines Leader, and the Independent, newspapers published at Des Moines, and Little Sioux, Iowa, without expense to the State.
