## CHAPTER 47.

## DISCHARGE OF NON RESIDENT INSANE.

AN ACT to Amend Section 1419, of the Code, Relating to the Dis-8. F. 24. charge of Non-residents Insane.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

Code, section 1419 amended,

To be paid from State treasury.

SECTION 1. That Section 1419 of the Code be and the same is hereby amended by adding after the word "proper" in the last line thereof, the following, to wit: The cost of such removal to be paid directly from the State treasury upon the sworn statement of the superintendent and approval of the trustees appended to each voucher, and counties from which such patients are hereafter received, shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred in sending such patients to the hospital, claim for such reimbursement to be certified to by the county auditor and be paid directly from the State treasury.

Publication.

SEC. 2. This act being deemed of immediate importance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Des Moines Leader and Iowa State Register, newspapers published in Des Moines, Iowa. Approved March 24, 1886.

SECTION 1. That chapter nine, title four of the Code be amended by adding to section 384 thereof the following: "Provided that when the citizens of any township so set off desire to dissolve their township organization and return again to the Same proceed-ings as in sectownship from which they were taken, they may do so by the same procedure as provided in section 382 and 383 for the division except that said petition shall be signed by a majority of the electors of both townships."
