

CHAPTER 172.

COMPENSATION OF ATTORNEY GENERAL.

AN ACT to amend Section 3770 of the Code of Iowa, [relating to Com- S. F. 308.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

SECTION 1. That Section 3770 of the Code of Iowa, be and Code sec. 3770

Section 3770. The salary of the Attorney General Attorney-gen-
shall be fifteen hundred dollars, per annum, and when- eral's salary,
ever he is required by the duties of his office, or by \$1,500.
directions of the governor or general assembly, to at-
tend any of the courts of this state, or any federal courts
of this or any other state, he shall receive in addition to
his salary, five dollars for each day he attends such
courts, and the same mileage in going to and from such
courts, as is allowed members of the general assembly,
for attending sessions thereof to be computed by the
nearest practicable route. Per diem and
mileage.
