That after this election in March. all sub-directors Terms three shall be elected and hold office for a term of three years.

That all acts or parts of acts inconsistent with the Repealing provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 21.

MEETING OF INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

AN ACT to Amend Chapter 9, Title XII, of the Code of 1878, by H. F. 495. adding thereto, Providing for calling in certain contingencies, meetings of independent districts.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

SECTION 1. That chapter 9, of title XII of the Code of 1873, be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto, after section 1807, the following, to-wit: Sec. 1807. When an independent district, by fire or otherwise, has been deprived Loss of school house by fire. of a school building, and the board of directors of such district. by the use of the powers in them vested, are unable to provide for the continuance of the school for which such building has been used; then such board of directors shall call a meeting of Meeting called. The manner of calling such meeting, and the powers of such meeting, shall be as follows:

First. The board of directors shall cause to be posted in Manner of callthree public places in such district, at least ten days prior to the designated time of holding such meeting, written notices of such meeting, in which shall be stated the time and place of such meeting and the object or purpose for which the same is

called.

The powers of such meeting shall be the same as Second. are prescribed in section 1807 hereof, except those powers which are set forth after the word "district" in the sixth line thereof.

This act being deemed of immediate importance, SEC. 2. shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Iowa State Register and Iowa State Leader, newspapers published at Des Moines Iowa.
