## CHAPTER 173.

## TIPS OR GRATUITIES.

S. F. 429.

AN ACT relating to the accepting and giving of tips or gratuities, and providing a penalty therefor.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- SECTION 1. Accepting or soliciting gratuities or tips. 2 employee of any hotel, restaurant, barber shop, or other public place, 3 and every employee of any person, firm, partnership, or corporation, or 4 of any public service corporation engaged in the transportation of passengers in this state, who shall accept or solicit any gratuity, tip, or other thing of value or of valuable consideration, from any guest 6 or patron, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction 7 8 thereof shall be fined not less than five dollars (\$5.00), or more than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), or be imprisoned in the county jail for a 9 period not exceeding thirty (30) days. 10
  - SEC. 2. Giving or offering gratuities or tips. Every person who shall give or offer any tip or gratuity to any person or employee prohibited from receiving or soliciting the same by the provisions of the preceding section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and be punished upon conviction as provided by the preceding section.
  - Sec. 3. **Permitting violations—posting signs.** Any person who shall knowingly permit a violation of this act in any place under his control or who shall fail to keep conspicuously posted in every said place under his control a notice bearing the words "No tipping allowed" shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and be punished as provided in section 1.
