- compensation as fixed by the above schedule in this act; and in counties where the district court is held at two different places the county treasurer shall receive five hundred dollars (\$500) in addition to the compensation as fixed by the above schedule in this act.
- SEC. 2. Compensation in full—fees, etc. The treasurer shall accept the salary herein provided in full compensation for all services performed under color of his office. All fees of every kind and nature which he receives for services performed in his official capacity or on matters pertaining to the records in his office, shall belong to the county and shall be paid into the county treasury quarterly; provided, that boards of supervisors in counties having a population of 40,000 or over, in which there are cities of the first class, including cities acting under special charter and commission form of government, may allow additional compensation to county treasurers not to exceed \$50 per annum for each 5,000 population of said cities.

CHAPTER 259.

DEPUTY COUNTY AUDITORS.

S. F. 342.

AN ACT to amend section four hundred eighty-one (481) of the code, relating to the appointment and compensation of deputy county auditors.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

SECTION 1. Deputy auditor—compensation. That section four hundred eighty-one (481) of the code, be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto the following:

"Provided that in counties having a population of twenty-five thousand or over, the salary of the first deputy and in counties in which the district court is held in two places the salaries of the first and second deputies shall be one-half that of his principal, and in case additional deputies or clerks are needed, the board of supervisors may make such allowance therefor as they may deem reasonable.
