## CHAPTER 131.

## OF FIRE DEPARTMENTS.

## H. F. 61.

AN ACT to repeal section seven hundred sixteen-a (716-a), as it appears in the supplement to the code, 1913, and to enact a substitute therefor.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

SECTION 1. Levy for maintenance of fire department. That section seven hundred sixteen-a (716-a) as it appears in the supplement to the code, 1913, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in lieu thereof:
The council of any city, including cities under a commission plan

The council of any city, including cities under a commission plan of government, with a population in excess of nine thousand (9,000), shall have the power to levy a special tax not exceeding six mills on the dollar each year, and the city council of any city with a population of nine thousand (9,000) or less shall have the power to levy a special tax not exceeding three mills on the dollar each year; and the town council of any incorporated town shall have the power to levy a special tax not exceeding two mills on the dollar each year, upon all taxable property in said city or town, for the purpose of maintaining a fire department; and the money so raised shall constitute a fire fund and shall be used for no other purpose, except that incorporated towns may use such fund to purchase fire equipment; provided, however, that in any cities under the commission plan of government having a population of ninety thousand (90,000)

or over, said levy shall not exceed three (3) mills.
