# CHAPTER 305.

## TOWN OF PISGAH.

#### H. F. 628.

AN ACT to legalize the acts and ordinances of the town of Pisgah, Iowa.

WHEREAS, doubts have arisen as to the legality and regularity of the acts and ordinances of the incorporated town of Pisgah, Iowa: therefore,

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- SECTION 1. General legalization. That the acts of the town council in the passage and publication of the ordinances of the incor-
- porated town of Pisgah, Iowa, be and the same are hereby affirmed,
- ratified and legalized as fully and completely as if all the provisions
- of law had been complied with, providing that nothing herein con-
- tained shall affect pending litigation.
- 1 Publication clause. This act being deemed of immediate
- importance shall take effect and be in force from and after its pub-
- lication in the Des Moines Register, a newspaper published in Des 3
- Moines, Iowa, and in the Logan Observer, a newspaper published in Logan, Iowa. Said publication to be without expense to the state.

# CHAPTER 306.

IN RE PLAT TO TOWN OF BRUSH CREEK (NOW ARLINGTON).

## H. F. 152.

AN ACT to legalize the platting of an addition to the town of Brush Creek, (now Arlington), Iowa, executed by Fred Glime, J. O. Hoover, W. H. Hoover, Ed. Rice, N. R. Hathaway and A. Rawson, dated March 28th, 1882, and filed for record in the office of the recorder of Fayette County, Iowa, June 19, 1882.

WHEREAS, Fred Glime, J. O. Hoover, W. H. Hoover, Ed. Rice, H. R. Hathaway and A. Rawson, who were then residents of Brush Creek, Fayette county, Iowa, did on the 7th day of June, 1881, A. D., form a corporation under the laws of the state of Iowa, to be known as the "Park Association of Brush Creek, Iowa", and

WHEREAS, articles of incorporation were duly filed in the office of the recorder of Fayette county, Iowa, on the 10th day of June, 1881, A. D., and

WHEREAS, the said articles of incorporation expressly stated, article 2, "The object of the association shall be to purchase a certain tract of land
