## CHAPTER 289.

CARE AND COMFORT OF IOWA'S SOLDIERS, SAILORS AND MARINES.

H. F. 347.

AN ACT making an appropriation for the care and comfort of Iowa's returning soldiers and sailors.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- Iowa's returning soldiers, etc. appropriation. There is hereby appropriated out of any unexpended balance of the fund appropriated by chapter two hundred seven (207) of the laws of the thirty-seventh general assembly for war purposes, the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) for the use and benefit of Iowa's returning soldiers, sailors and marines, who are ill and temporarily being care for in hospitals in New York City or other port cities, and for such returning soldiers, sailors and marines. for such returning soldiers, sailors and marines who may be discharged on landing in New York City or other coast cities or Chicago, 9 10 and who may be temporarily detained in said cities on the way home and may be in need of assistance, and for the expense of the estab-11 lishment of temporary headquarters for such soldiers, sailors and marines in New York City. 12 13
- Commission appointment by governor. Immediately 1 upon the passage and publication of this act it shall be the duty of the governor to appoint a commission of three persons, including the adjutant general of the state who shall act as chairman, who shall disburse and account for the funds by this act appropriated, and who shall act without any compensation, but with an allowance of actual expenses. Two members of said commission may be nonresidents of the state one of whom shall be a resident of New York and one a resi-.

dent of Chicago.

- SEC. 3. Expenditures requisition in detail. That all sums drawn on the appropriation herein made shall be drawn by a warrant of the auditor of state on the treasurer of state upon a requisition made by the commission provided for in the preceding section, and endorsed by the governor, and such requisition shall set forth in detail the purpose for which the sum therein named has been expended or is to be used, and such expenditures shall be audited as other expenditures are audited.
- SEC. 4. Publication clause. This act being deemed of immediate importance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and publication in the Des Moines Register and Des Moines Capital, newspapers published in the city of Des Moines, Iowa.

## CHAPTER 290.

## VISITING OR PUBLIC HEALTH NURSES.

H. F. 557.

AN ACT giving boards of supervisors, city and town councils, and school boards the authority and power to employ visiting or public health nurses and to pay the salary and expenses thereof.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- SECTION 1. Public health nurses authority to employ salaries and expenses. That the boards of supervisors, the city and town councils, and the school boards in this state shall have the power and authority to employ visiting or public health nurses at such periods each year and in such numbers as they may deem advisable and to pay the salaries and expenses thereof from the funds in the treasuries of said boards and councils.
- SEC. 2. Co-operation in employment apportionment of salaries, etc. That the said board of supervisors, the city and town councils, and the school boards in any county in the state may co-operate in the employment of said visiting or public health nurses and may apportion the salaries and expenses thereof to the various territories represented by them.
- SEC. 3. Duties prescribed. That the said boards of supervisors, the city and town councils, and the school boards shall at the time of the employment of visiting or public health nurses prescribe the duties thereof which shall in a general way be for the promotion and conservation of the public health.
