- acquire real estate for the necessary and convenient use of such society or association in the same manner as is provided by law for taking private property for works of internal improvement by chapter four (4), title ten (X) of the code.
- SEC. 2. Publication clause. This act being deemed of immediate importance, shall be in force and effect on and after its passage and publication in the Des Moines Register, a newspaper published in Des Moines, Iowa, and the Fayette County Union, published in West Union, Iowa, all without expense to the state.

CHAPTER 293.

COMPENSATION OF COUNTY OFFICERS.

S. F. 124.

An ACT to repeal the law as it appears in sections four hundred seventy-nine (479), four hundred ninety (490), four hundred ninety-five (495) and five hundred ten a (510-a) supplemental supplement to the code, 1915, and section one (1) of chapter four hundred twenty-six (426) of the acts of the thirty-seventh general assembly, and section two thousand seven hundred forty-two (2742) supplement to the code, 1913, and to enact substitutes in lieu thereof, relating to the duties and compensation of county officers.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

SECTION 1. Repeal and substitute — county auditor — compensa-1 tion schedule. That section four hundred seventy-nine (479), sup-2 plemental supplement to the code, 1915, be and the same is hereby 3 repealed and the following enacted in lieu thereof:

"Each county auditor shall receive for his services the following compensation: In counties having a population of less than ten thou-6 7 sand, seventeen hundred dollars; in counties having a population of ten thousand and less than fifteen thousand, eighteen hundred dollars; in counties having a population of fifteen thousand and less than twenty thousand, nineteen hundred dollars; in counties having a population of twenty thousand and less than twenty-five thousand, two 10 thousand dollars; in counties having a population of twenty-five thou-11 sand and less than thirty thousand, twenty-one hundred dollars; in 12 13 counties having a population of thirty thousand and less than thirtyfive thousand, twenty-two hundred dollars; in counties having a popu-14 lation of thirty-five thousand and less than forty thousand, twenty-15 four hundred dollars; in counties having a population of forty thousand and less than fifty thousand, twenty-eight hundred dollars; in 16 17 counties having a population of fifty thousand and less than sixty 18 19 thousand, three thousand fifty dollars; in counties having a popula-20 tion of sixty thousand and less than sixty-five thousand, thirty-three

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21 hundred dollars; and in all counties having a population of sixty-five 22 thousand or over, thirty-four hundred dollars.

Provided, however, that in counties having a population of over twenty-five thousand having a special charter city where the county auditor prepares and makes up the city tax books for such special charter city, the county auditor shall receive three hundred dollars in addition to the compensation as fixed by the above schedule in this And in counties having two places at which the district court is held, he shall receive as additional compensation the sum of five hundred dollars.

SEC. 2. Repeal and substitute -- county treasurer -- compensation schedule. That section four hundred ninety (490) supplemental supplement to the code, 1915, be and the same is hereby repealed, and the following enacted in lieu thereof:

"Each county treasurer shall receive for his services the following compensation: in counties having a population of less than ten thousand, seventeen hundred dollars; in counties having a population of ten thousand and less than fifteen thousand, eighteen hundred dollars; in counties having a population of fifteen thousand and less than twenty thousand, nineteen hundred dollars; in counties having a population of twenty thousand and less than twenty-five thousand, two thousand dollars; in counties having a population of twenty-five thousand and less than thirty thousand, twenty-one hundred dollars; in counties having a population of thirty thousand and less than thirtyfive thousand, twenty-two hundred dollars; in counties having a population of thirty-five thousand and less than forty thousand, twenty-four hundred dollars; in counties having a population of forty thousand and less than fifty thousand, twenty-eight hundred dollars; in counties having a population of fifty thousand and less than sixty thousand, three thousand fifty dollars; in counties having a population sixty thousand and less than sixty-five thousand, thirty-three hundred dollars; and in all counties having a population of sixty-five thousand and over, thirty-four hundred dollars.

Provided, however, that in counties having a population of over twenty-five thousand, having a special charter city where the taxes are collected by the county treasurer, three hundred dollars in addition to the compensation as fixed by the above schedule in this act; and in counties where the district court is held at two different places the county treasurer shall receive five hundred dollars in addition to the compensation as fixed by the above schedule in this act.

County recorder - compensation schedule. That section four hundred ninety-five (495), supplemental supplement to the code, 1915, be amended by striking from said section all after the period (.) in the ninth (9) line thereof and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

"Each county recorder shall receive for his services the following compensation: in counties having a population of less than fifteen thousand, sixteen hundred dollars; in counties having a population of fifteen thousand and less than twenty thousand, seventeen hundred dollars; in counties having a population of twenty thousand and less than twenty-five thousand, eighteen hundred dollars; in counties having a population of twenty-five thousand and less than thirty thousand, nineteen hundred dollars; in counties having a population of

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thirty thousand and less than thirty-five thousand, two thousand dol-lars; in counties having a population of thirty-five thousand and less than forty thousand, twenty-one hundred dollars; in counties having a population of forty thousand and less than fifty thousand, twenty-two hundred dollars; in counties having a population of fifty thousand and less than sixty thousand, twenty-three hundred dollars; in counties having a population of sixty thousand and less than seventy thousand, twenty-four hundred dollars; in counties having a popula-tion of seventy thousand and less than ninety thousand, twenty-five hundred dollars; in counties having a population of ninety thousand and over, thirty-one hundred dollars.

Provided, however, that in counties where a recorder's office is kept in two different places the county recorder shall receive five hundred (\$500) dollars in addition to the compensation as fixed by the above

28 schedule in this act."

SEC. 4. Repeal and substitute — county sheriff — compensation schedule — fees — allowance. That section five hundred ten-a (510-a) supplemental supplement to the code 1915, be and the same is hereby repealed, and the following enacted in lieu thereof:

"Each county sheriff shall receive for his services the following compensation: in counties having a population of less than fifteen thousand, seventeen hundred dollars; in counties having a population of fifteen thousand and less than twenty thousand, eighteen hundred dollars; in counties having a population of twenty thousand and less than twenty-five thousand, nineteen hundred dollars; in counties having a population of twenty-five thousand and less than thirty-five thousand, twenty hundred dollars; in counties having a population of thirty-five thousand and less than forty thousand, twenty-one hundred dollars; in counties having a population of fifty thousand and less than sixty thousand, twenty-four hundred dollars; in counties having a population of sixty thousand and less than sixty-five thousand, twenty-six hundred dollars; in counties having a population of sixty thousand and less than sixty-five thousand, twenty-six hundred dollars; in counties having a population of sixty-five thousand and over, twenty-eight hundred dollars.

All fees collected, except mileage, shall be paid to the clerk of the district court for the use of the county and all fees earned, except mileage, and uncollected at the end of each year shall belong to the county and when paid shall be reported to the board of supervisors by the clerk of the district court and paid into the county treasurer. In counties where the sheriff is not furnished a residence by the county an additional sum of three hundred (\$300.00) dollars per annum shall

27 be allowed."

SEC. 5. Repeal and substitute — clerk of district court — compensation schedule. That section one (1) of chapter four hundred twenty-six (426) of the acts of the thirty-seventh general assembly, be and the same is hereby repealed, and the following enacted in lieu thereof:

"Each clerk of the district court shall receive for his services the following compensation: in counties having a population of less than ten thousand, seventeen-hundred dollars; in counties having a population of ten thousand and less than fifteen thousand, eighteen-hundred dollars; in counties having a population of fifteen thousand and less

than twenty thousand, nineteen-hundred dollars; in counties having 10 a population of twenty thousand and less than twenty-five thousand, 11 12 two thousand dollars; in counties having a population of twenty-five 13 thousand and less than thirty thousand, twenty-one hundred dollars; in counties having a population of thirty thousand and less than 14 15 thirty-five thousand, twenty-two hundred dollars; in counties having 16 a population of thirty-five thousand and less than forty thousand, twenty-four hundred dollars; in counties having a population of forty 17 thousand and less than fifty thousand, twenty-eight hundred dollars; 18 19 in counties having a population of fifty thousand and less than sixty thousand, three thousand fifty dollars; in counties having a popula-20 tion of sixty thousand and less than sixty-five thousand, thirty-three 21 22 hundred dollars; in counties having a population of sixty-five thousand and over, thirty-four hundred dollars. Provided, however, that 23 24 in counties where the district court is held in two places he shall receive as additional compensation the sum of four hundred dollars. 25

Repeal and substitute — county superintendent of schools ation schedule. That section twenty-seven hundred SEC. 6. - compensation schedule. forty-two (2742), supplement to the code, 1913, be and the same is hereby repealed and the following enacted in lieu thereof:

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4 Each county superintendent of schools shall receive for his services the following compensation: In counties having a population of less than ten thousand (10,000), \$1,600.00; in counties having a population of ten thousand (10,000) and less than twenty thousand (20,000), 5 6 7 8 \$1,700.00; in counties having a population of twenty thousand (20,000) and less than thirty thousand (30,000), \$1,800.00; in counties having a population of thirty thousand (30,000) and less than 9 10 forty thousand (40,000), \$1,900.00; in counties having a population 11 of forty thousand (40,000) and less than fifty thousand (50,000), 12 13 \$2,000.00; in counties having a population of fifty thousand (50,000) or more the sum of \$2,500.00; and in all cases such superintendent 14 15 shall receive the expenses of necessary office stationery and postage 16 and those incurred in attending upon meetings called by the superin-17 tendent of public instruction; claims therefor to be made by verified 18 statement filed with the county auditor who shall draw his warrant 19 upon the county treasurer therefor; Provided, that, where county superintendents are now receiving by action of the board of super-20 visors a sum greater than the amount fixed herein, this law shall not 21 22 be construed so as to reduce said sum." 23

"Any increase in salaries provided for in this act shall not apply

24 after June 30th, 1921."

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County officers — salaries — how paid. The salaries of all county officers included in this act shall be paid out of the county 3 treasury in equal monthly installments.

1 Publication clause. This act being deemed of immediate importance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its 2 3 publication in the Des Moines Register and the Des Moines Capital, newspapers published in Des Moines, Iowa.
