

CHAPTER 218

STATE BUDGET

H. F. 14

AN ACT to establish the general fund for the state of Iowa for the biennium beginning July 1, 1925, and ending June 30, 1927, and to appropriate therefrom for all departments, and the various divisions thereof, of the state of Iowa, for all purposes provided for by law, for the said biennium, and to repeal section forty-one hundred eighty-seven (4187) of the code, 1924.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 SECTION 1. That the amount derived from direct taxation, other
 2 than from the bonus levy, during the fiscal years beginning July 1,
 3 1925, and July 1, 1926, and ending June 30, 1926, and June 30, 1927,
 4 respectively, together with any unexpended appropriations at the
 5 close of the biennium ending June 30, 1925, and all revenue from
 6 sources other than direct taxation which is available for appropri-
 7 ation for state purposes, and all other money in the state treasury
 8 which is not by law segregated, shall be established as a general
 9 fund, and so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be, and the
 10 same is hereby appropriated for the biennium beginning July 1, 1925
 11 and ending June 30, 1927, in the following manner and for the fol-
 12 lowing uses, to-wit:

9 be construed to require the auditor of state to keep a separate
10 account for each specific item in an appropriation made to any de-
11 partment, but such account may be kept in the aggregate amount
12 of the appropriation.

1 SEC. 57. No state department, institution or agency receiving
2 appropriations under the provisions of this act shall expend funds
3 or approve claims in excess of its appropriations, except as other-
4 wise provided by this act. If the expenditures of any state depart-
5 ment, institution or agency shall in any other manner exceed the
6 amount of its appropriations, the members of the governing board
7 of any such state department, institution or agency who shall have
8 voted for such excessive expenditure, or, if there be no governing
9 board, the head of any such state department, institution or agency,
10 making such excessive expenditure, or approving such excessive
11 claims shall be personally liable for the full amount of the unauthor-
12 ized deficit thus created.

13 The executive council, with the approval of the budget director, is
14 authorized where the appropriation for any department, institution,
15 or agency is insufficient to properly meet the legitimate expense of
16 such department, institution, or agency of the state, to transfer
17 from any other department, institution, or agency of the state having
18 an appropriation in excess of its necessity, sufficient funds to meet
19 such deficiency.

1 SEC. 58. No obligation of any kind whatsoever shall be incurred
2 or created subsequent to June 30, 1927, against any appropriation
3 made by this act, unless otherwise specifically provided by law, and,
4 on June 30, 1927, it shall be the duty of the head of each depart-
5 ment, board or commission, receiving appropriations under the pro-
6 visions of this act, to file with the auditor of state a list of all
7 expenditures for which warrants have not been drawn.

1 SEC. 59. Except where otherwise specifically provided by law, all
2 appropriations made by this act, remaining unexpended or unob-
3 ligated, at the close of business on June 30, 1927, shall revert to and
4 become a part of the general fund in the state treasury; provided,
5 however, that all balances remaining in the appropriations which
6 have been made annually for each year of the biennium, shall revert
7 annually.

1 SEC. 60. This act being deemed of immediate importance shall
2 take effect and be in full force on and after July 1, 1925, and shall
3 be published in the Plain Talk, a newspaper published in Des Moines,
4 Iowa, and the Hardin County Ledger, a newspaper published in
5 Eldora, Iowa.
