- 14 mitment to any United States veterans' bureau hospital within the 15 state of Iowa and such veteran upon admission shall be subject to
- 16 the rules and regulations of the hospital and United States veterans'
- bureau hospital authorities are invested with the same powers granted
- 18 to superintendents of state hospitals for insane with reference to
- 19 retention and custody of patients so committed.

## CHAPTER 71

## PROBATION OFFICERS

## S. F. 191

AN ACT to repeal paragraph two (2) of section thirty-six hundred twelve (3612) of the code and to enact a substitute therefor, relating to the appointment of probation officers.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- 1 SECTION 1. Paragraph two (2) of section thirty-six hundred 2 twelve (3612) of the code is repealed and the following is enacted 3 in lieu thereof, to wit:
- "2. In counties which contain an educational institution under the control of the state board of education with a student enrollment of at least six thousand (6,000) and in counties having a population of more than thirty thousand (30,000) and less than fifty thousand (50,000), a chief probation officer at a salary of not more than fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500) per year; and the court may also appoint one (1) deputy at a salary of not more than twelve hundred (\$1,200) per year."
  - SEC. 2. There is hereby enacted and inserted in the code, immediately following section thirty-six hundred sixteen (3616), the following:
  - "3616-b1. The salaries and expenses of probation officers and deputies in counties which contain an educational institution under the control of the state board of education with a student enrollment of at least forty-two hundred, may be paid either from the general county fund or from the court expense fund."
