- By inserting the words "or appointed" in line two (2) of para-4
- graph seven (7) immediately after the word "elected".

 2. By inserting the words "or appoint" in line three (3) of para-5 6 graph seven (7) immediately after the word "elect".
- SEC. 3. Publication. This act being deemed of immediate importance shall take effect from and after its publication in two (2) news-2 papers of this state as provided by law.

CHAPTER 145

RIGHTS UNDER CIVIL SERVICE

AN ACT amending section fifty-six hundred ninety-four (5694) of the code, 1927, relating to the chiefs of police and fire departments in cities under the manager plan.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- SECTION 1. Section fifty-six hundred ninety-four (5694) of the code, 1927, is amended by striking out the period (.) following the word "police" in the twenty-first line thereof, and substituting therefor a semi-colon (;) and adding the following: "provided, however, that in cities under the manager plan having a population of thirty thousand (30,000) or more, a chief of police who has served continuously in that position for ten years or more, shall be deemed entitled to the benefit's and protection of this chapter, but nothing herein 5 to the benefit's and protection of this chapter, but nothing herein 8 shall extend to such officer any civil service right upon which he may 9 retain the position of chief." 10
 - SEC. 2. Section fifty-six hundred ninety-four (5694) of the code, 1927, is amended by striking out the period (.) following the word "plan" in the twenty-third line thereof and substituting a comma (,) therefor and adding the following: "unless such officer has been under civil service in said department prior to his appointment as chief."
