

CHAPTER 126

STATE BUDGET. ESTABLISHING GENERAL FUND OF STATE AND MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR BIENNIUM

House Substitute for H. F. 214

AN ACT to establish the general fund for the state of Iowa, for the biennium beginning July 1, 1935, and ending June 30, 1937, and to appropriate therefrom for all departments and various divisions thereof, of the state of Iowa, for all purposes provided by law, for the said biennium.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 SECTION 1. That the amount derived from delinquent state taxes,
 2 other than from the bonus levy, during the fiscal years beginning
 3 July 1, 1935, and July 1, 1936, and ending June 30, 1936, and June
 4 30, 1937, respectively, and all revenue from other sources, which is
 5 available for appropriations for state purposes, and all other money
 6 in the state treasury which is not by law segregated, shall be estab-
 7 lished as a general fund, and so much thereof as may be necessary,
 8 shall be, and the same is hereby appropriated for the biennium
 9 beginning July 1, 1935, and ending June 30, 1937, in the following
 10 manner and for the following uses, to wit:

 152 or all institutions under the control of said
 153 board\$ 14,000.00

ADDITIONAL EMERGENCY FUND

154 17. For the board of control institutions there is hereby appro-
 155 priated for each year of the biennium beginning July 1, 1935, and
 156 ending June 30, 1937, the sum of one hundred thousand (100,000)
 157 dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary, to meet any emer-
 158 gency or contingency that may arise at any of the institutions under
 159 the board, but no expenditures shall be made from this fund without
 160 the approval of the governor and the state comptroller first obtained.

1 SEC. 45. For the state board of education, for the administration,
 2 maintenance, operation, additions and betterments of the state uni-
 3 versity of Iowa, at Iowa City; the Iowa state college of agriculture
 4 and mechanic arts, at Ames; the Iowa state teachers college, at Cedar
 5 Falls; the Iowa school for the deaf, at Council Bluffs; the Iowa school
 6 for the blind, at Vinton; the university hospital, at Iowa City; the
 7 psychopathic hospital, at Iowa City; and the bacteriological labora-
 8 tory, at Iowa City; and for soldiers tuition:

9 There is hereby appropriated the sum of five million eight hundred
 10 forty-one thousand seven hundred twenty (5,841,720) dollars or
 11 so much thereof as may be necessary, for each year of the biennium
 12 beginning July 1, 1935, and ending June 30, 1937, to be used in the
 13 following manner and for the following purposes, to wit:

STATE UNIVERSITY OF IOWA

14 1. For the state university of Iowa, at Iowa City, for each year
 15 of said biennium, the sum of one million nine hundred fifty thousand
 16 (1,950,000) dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary, for sal-
 17 aries other than the president, support, maintenance, equipment and
 18 general improvements.

19 a. There is hereby appropriated for the salary of the president of
 20 the state university of Iowa for each year of the biennium beginning
 21 July 1, 1935, and ending June 30, 1937, a sum not to exceed ten thou-

46 5. For the Iowa school for the blind at Vinton, for each year of

MEDICAL AND SURGICAL TREATMENT OF INDIGENT PERSONS,
 UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL

51 6. For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of chapter one
 52 hundred ninety-nine (199), code, 1931, for each year of said bien-
 53 nium, the sum of nine hundred forty thousand, nine hundred ninety-
 54 four (940,994) dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary, to
 55 be expended in the manner and under the authority provided in said
 56 chapter.

PSYCHOPATHIC HOSPITAL

57 7. For the psychopathic hospital, at Iowa City, for each year of
 58 said biennium the sum of one hundred thousand (100,000) dollars
 59 or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be used in the manner
 60 and under the authority provided in chapter one hundred ninety-seven
 61 (197), code, 1931; provided, however, that said amount shall be avail-
 62 able in monthly installments, not exceeding eight thousand three hun-
 63 dred thirty-three (8,333) dollars and that said installments shall be
 64 expended only upon the submission of bills in the manner provided
 65 in section three thousand nine hundred eighty-four (3984) of said
 66 chapter.

BACTERIOLOGICAL LABORATORY

67 8. For the bacteriological laboratory, at Iowa City, for each year
 68 of said biennium, the sum of twelve thousand two hundred twenty-
 69 six (12,226) dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be
 70 used in the manner and under the authority provided in chapter one
 71 hundred ninety-six (196), code, 1931.

SOLDIERS TUITION

72 9. The sum of four thousand (4,000) dollars or so much thereof
 73 as may be necessary, for each year of the biennium beginning July
 74 1, 1935, and ending June 30, 1937, for the payment of tuition for
 75 honorably discharged soldiers or sailors of the world war of the
 76 United States who are citizens of the state of Iowa, who enroll in
 77 any division of the State university, at Iowa City, or the college of
 78 agriculture and mechanic arts at Ames, said payment being fixed
 79 at twenty (20) dollars for each such student for each semester and
 80 each summer school.

 84 fifty (150) dollars for any one child, for any one year, who shall
 85 have lived in the state of Iowa two (2) years preceding application

 87 during the World War between the dates of April 6, 1917, and July
 88 22, 1921, while serving in the army, navy, or marine corps of the
 89 United States, as a result of such service; to defray the expenses of
 90 tuition, matriculation, laboratory and similar fees, books, and supplies,
 91 for such child or children—not including clothing—for attendance at
 92 any educational or training institution of college grade, located within

 96 applicants shall be certified by the adjutant general of Iowa, to the

 99 this appropriation shall be paid to the individual or institution by the

GENERAL CONTINGENT FUND

1 SEC. 46. For the purpose of establishing a general contingent
 2 fund for the state, there is hereby appropriated for each year of the
 3 biennium beginning July 1, 1935, and ending June 30, 1937, the sum
 4 of eighty thousand (80,000) dollars or so much thereof as may be
 5 necessary, to be administered by the committee on retrenchment and
 6 reform for contingencies arising during the biennium, which are
 7 legally payable from the general fund of the state.

INSURANCE DEPARTMENT

1 SEC. 47. The insurance commissioner is hereby authorized to
 2 employ not to exceed eighteen (18) insurance examiners, of which
 3 examiners the commissioner may designate two examiners in charge
 4 at per diem not to exceed seventeen (17) dollars and fifty (50) cents
 5 each, and expenses as herein provided, all other examiners at per
 6 diem not exceeding fifteen (15) dollars each, and their actual and
 7 necessary expenses while engaged in the performance of their duties,
 8 said per diem and expenses to be paid from funds in the state treas-
 9 ury upon presentation of proper vouchers and warrants; provided,
 10 however, that the state treasurer shall be reimbursed in the manner
 11 and under the authority provided in sections eight thousand six hun-
 12 dred thirty-two (8632) and eight thousand six hundred thirty-three

COUNTY AND MUNICIPAL EXAMINERS

1 SEC. 48. The auditor of state is hereby authorized to employ
 2 county, municipal, and school examiners and assistants at a per diem

3 not exceeding seven (7) dollars each, and their actual and necessary
4 expenses while engaged in the performance of their duties, to be paid
5 in the manner provided in sections one hundred twenty-five (125)
6 and one hundred twenty-six (126), code, 1931.

PIONEER LAW MAKERS

1 SEC. 49. For the pioneer law makers there is hereby appropriated
2 the sum of seventy-five (75) dollars or so much thereof as may be
3 necessary for each year of the biennium beginning July 1, 1935, and
4 ending June 30, 1937.

PRESIDENTIAL ELECTORS

1 SEC. 50. For the presidential electors there is hereby appropriated
2 the sum of one hundred fifty (150) dollars or so much thereof as may
3 be necessary for each year of the biennium beginning July 1, 1935,
4 and ending June 30, 1937.

BOARD OF ENGINEERING EXAMINERS

1 SEC. 51. The board of engineering examiners is hereby author-
2 ized to pay its secretary a salary of six hundred (600) dollars per
3 year and to pay a clerk three hundred (300) dollars per year, to be
4 paid out of funds belonging to the board of engineering examiners.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

1 SEC. 52. The governing board of any state department, institu-
2 tion, or agency, or, if there be no governing board, the head of any
3 department, institution or agency, in the interest of economy and
4 efficiency, may, with the written consent and approval of the governor
5 and state comptroller, first obtained, at any time during the biennium,
6 partially or wholly use its unexpended appropriations for purposes
7 properly within the scope of such department, institution or agency.

1 SEC. 53. No state department, institution, or agency receiving
2 appropriations under the provisions of this act shall expend funds
3 or approve claims in excess of its appropriations except as otherwise
4 provided in this act. If the expenditures of any state department,
5 institution, or agency, shall in any other manner exceed the amounts
6 of its appropriation, the members of the governing board of any such
7 state department, institution or agency who shall have voted for such
8 excessive expenditures, or, if there be no governing board, the head
9 of any such state department, institution, or agency making excessive
10 expenditure or approving excessive claims shall be personally liable
11 for the full amount of the unauthorized deficit thus created.

12 When the appropriation of any department, institution or agency,
13 is insufficient to properly meet the legitimate expense of such depart-
14 ment, institution or agency of the state, the state comptroller, with
15 the approval of the governor, is authorized to transfer from any other
16 department, institution or agency of the state having an appropriation
17 in excess of its necessity, sufficient funds to meet that deficiency.

1 SEC. 54. No obligation of any kind, whatsoever, shall be incurred
2 or created subsequent to June 30, 1937, against any appropriation
3 made by this act, unless otherwise specifically provided by law, and,

4 on June 30, 1937, it shall be the duty of the head of each department,
5 board or commission, receiving appropriations under the provisions
6 of this act, to file with the state comptroller a list of all expenditures
7 for which warrants have not been drawn.

1 SEC. 55. Except where otherwise specifically provided by law, all
2 appropriations made by this act, remaining unexpended or unobli-
3 gated, at the close of business on December 31, 1937, shall revert to
4 and become a part of the general fund in the state treasury.

1 SEC. 56. All salaries provided for by this act are in lieu of all
2 existing statutory salaries, for the positions provided herein, and
3 shall be payable in equal monthly or semi-monthly installments, and
4 shall be in full compensation for all services except as otherwise
5 expressly provided.
6 Employees of the state are granted one week's vacation after one
7 year's steady employment and two week's vacation after two or more
8 year's employment, with pay. Leave of absence of thirty days is
9 granted to employees on account of sickness or injury, accumulative
10 for three consecutive years, with pay at the discretion of the heads
11 of departments.

1 SEC. 57. Employees of the state shall be under the control of the
2 head of the department and the compensation shall be subject to
3 approval of the governor and state comptroller. Any employee may
4 be assigned to such duties as the department head shall direct.

1 SEC. 58. For the office of state comptroller there is hereby set
2 aside from the collection of taxes on motor vehicle fuel, the sum of
3 two thousand five hundred (2,500) dollars or so much thereof as may
4 be necessary annually, for use in employing sufficient help in writing
5 motor vehicle fuel tax refund warrants.

1 SEC. 59. For the office of the industrial commissioner there is
2 hereby set aside from the primary road fund the sum of fifteen thou-
3 sand (15,000) dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary annu-
4 ally, for use in paying all claims of the employees of the state highway
5 commission who are injured or killed while on duty, as provided for
6 in chapter seventy (70) of the code.

1 SEC. 60. For the office of the attorney general there is hereby set
2 aside from the primary road fund the sum of fifteen thousand (15,000)
3 dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary annually, for the
4 purpose of covering all costs of litigation arising from or pertaining
5 to primary roads.

1 SEC. 61. For the purpose of complying with the requirements of
2 the federal public works act and to make repairs, improvements and
3 betterments at the various state institutions there is hereby appropri-
4 ated the sum of four hundred fifty-five thousand three hundred
5 seventy-five (455,375) dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary
6 for each year of the biennium beginning July 1, 1935, and ending
7 June 30, 1937.

1 SEC. 62. Where any provisions of the laws of this state are in
 2 conflict with this act the provisions of this act shall govern for the
 3 biennium.

1 SEC. 63. All appropriations made by this act are to be recorded
 2 and accounted for as is the procedure for the appropriations for the
 3 present biennium.

1 SEC. 64. For the commission on uniform laws there is hereby
 2 appropriated for each year of the biennium beginning July 1, 1935,
 3 and ending June 30, 1937, the sum of six hundred (600) dollars or
 4 so much thereof as may be necessary to be used in the following
 5 manner:
