shall in any wise effect the rights or interests of the crediors or lawful heirs of said John Ross, if such there be. APPROVED January 18th, 1855.

## CHAPTER 40.

## CORNWALL HEIRS.

AN ACT for the relief of the heirs of George Cornwall, late of Lee County, deceased.

Section 1. Be it enacted, That the escheat to which this Escheat State is entitled to the lands, within the bounds of this State, which belonged to George Cornwall in his life time, and at the time of his death, late of Lee county, deceased, because of the alienship of his nephew and heir, John Cornwall, he and the same is hereby relinquished to said John Cornwall, who is to inherit said lands in the same way and manner and to the same purport and effect, as though he had been a native born citizen of the United States at the time of the death of said George Cornwall, Provided, that nothing in this Act contained shall in any wise effect the rights or interests of the creditors of said George Cornwall.

CHAPTER 41.

## AGRICULTURAL.

AN ACT to encourage Agriculture and the Mechanic Arts in Johnson county

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the County Judge State of Iowa, That on the first day of April, in each year, to draw warthe county Judge of Johnson county shall draw an order tapon the Treasurer of said county, in favor of the Johnson County Agricultural and Mechanical Society, for a sura Third of poll equal to thirty-three and one third per centum, upon the tax.
