## CHAPTER 122.

## STATE ROAD.

## AN ACT establishing a State Road from Indian Town, in Tama county, to Grinnell, in Poweshiek county.

- SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commission-State of Iowa, That Col. Isaac Butler and Jacob Bruner, of Tama county, and L. C. Phelps, of Poweshiek county, be and are hereby appointed Commissioners to establish and locate a State road from Indian Town, in Tama county, to Indian Town Grinnell Settlement, in Poweshiek county.

<sup>9</sup> 2. That the Commissioners thus appointed, shall meet Time and on the first Monday in April, A. D. 1855, or within nine <sup>place of meet</sup> months thereafter, at Indian Town, taking to their assistance a surveyor, the necessary chainmen, markers and teamsters, and after having been qualified, shall proceed to the discharge of their duties according to law.

§ 3. The commissioners, surveyor and assistants, herein  $P_{ay}$ . named, shall receive pay for their services in establishing said road in accordance with the provisions of law in such cases made and provided; but the State shall in no case be responsible for any expense growing out of the establishment of the foregoing road.
