RESOLUTION No. 34.

MAIL FACILITIES.

JOINT RESOLUTION asking Congress for additional mail facilities.

Resolved by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa, That our Senators be instructed, and our Representatives in Congress be requested, to use their influence to procure additional mail facilities in the State of Iowa, as follows:

1st. From Burlington, in Des Moines county, via. Augusta, Denmark, Fort Madison, Franklin and Primrose, in Lee county, to Farmington, Van Buren county, from Farmington to Bloomfield, in Davis county, and from thence to Centerville, in Appanoose county, in four horse coaches, six times a week.

2nd. From Farmington, Van Buren county, via. Bonaparte, Bentonsport, Winchester and Birmingham, to Fairfield, in Jefferson county, in two horse coaches, six times a week.

Resolved, That the Secretary of State be requested, to forward a copy of the foregoing resolution to each of our Senators and Representatives in Congress.
