COLONIZATION.

JOINT RESOLUTION on the subject of African Colonization.

Preamble.

Whereas, the American Colonization Society is now struggling with serious difficulty, in the accomplishment of their well-known benevolent object—the civilization and christianization of Africa, and building up a home for the colored population of the United States-in consequence of the irregular and mengre facilities for transportation between the coast of Africa and the United States:

Commence.

And whereas, the opening commerce of Liberia, and the other colonies on the coast of Africa, are now inviting our attention as a source of profit:

Slave Trade.

And whereas, notwithstanding the stringent laws now in existence in the United States against the slave trade, are, to a very great extent powerless, in consequence of the inability of the colonies on the African coast to protect themselves-therefore, be it

Instructions to

Resolved, by the Senate and House of Representatives of eur delegation the State of Io oa, That our Senators in Congress be instructed, and our Representatives requested, to use their influence to procure the immediate establishment of a regu-

Line of steam-lar line of steamers, to be employed in the trade between ers. the coast of Africa and the United States.
