CHAPTER 39

GENERAL CONTINGENT FUND

S. F. 519

AN ACT creating the general contingent fund of the state for the ensuing biennium and providing for the administration of said fund.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 SECTION 1. The general contingent fund of the state for the
2 biennium beginning July 1, 1949, and ending June 30, 1951, is hereby
3 created and said fund shall consist of the sum of one million dollars
4 hereby appropriated thereto from the general fund of the state. Said
5 contingent fund shall be administered by the joint committee on
6 retrenchment and reform and allocations therefrom may be made
7 only for contingencies arising during the biennium which are legally
8 payable from the funds of the state. No allocation from said fund
9 shall be made for the administration of, or carrying out, the provi-
10 sions of any act passed by the 53rd General Assembly which does not
11 contain an appropriation. Nor shall the committee on retrenchment
12 and reform allocate any funds for any purpose or project which was,
13 or should have been, presented to the general assembly by way of a
14 bill and which failed to become enacted into law. A report of the
15 dispositions made of the fund during the first eighteen months of
16 the biennium shall be made by the committee on retrenchment and
17 reform to the state comptroller prior to the convening of the 54th
18 General Assembly and by him included in the printed budget. Any
19 balance in said contingent fund as of June 30, 1951, shall revert to
20 the general fund of the state.
