1 SEC. 7. The provisions of all Acts or statutes in conflict or in-2 consistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed.

If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or 1 SEC. 8. phrase of this Act is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or 2 3 invalid, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect the con-4 stitutionality or validity of the remaining portions of this Act. The 5 General Assembly hereby declares that it would have passed this Act and each section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase hereof irrespective of whether any one or more of the sections, sub-6 7 8 sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional. 9

CHAPTER 25

APPROPRIATION TO EMPLOYMENT SECURITY COMMISSION

FOR BUILDING

S. F. 445

AN ACT to appropriate funds to the employment security commission as a proportionate share in the cost of erecting an administrative building for the use of the commission.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated from the general fund 2 of the state to the employment security commission the sum of 3 seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000.00) or so much thereof as 4 may be necessary, to be used for a proportionate share in the cost 5 of erecting a building for the use of the employment security com-6 mission in its administration of chapters ninety-six (96), ninety-7 seven B (97B), and ninety-seven C (97C), Code 1958.

1 SEC. 2. Any unobligated balance of funds herein appropriated 2 as of June 30, 1963, shall revert to the general fund of the state.

1 SEC. 3. This Act being deemed of immediate importance shall be 2 in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication in 3 The Fayette County Union, a newspaper published at West Union, 4 Iowa, and in the Cedar Valley Daily Times, a newspaper published at 5 Vinton, Iowa.
