# CHAPTER 46.

## CITY OF OSKALOOSA.

AN ACT to extend the corporate limits of the city of Oskaloosa.

#### Extension.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa, That the corporate limits of the city of Oskaloosa be, and the same are hereby extended so as to include the territory bounded by the following line, to wit: "Commencing at the south-west corner of the original town plat of Oskaloosa, thence west to the south-west corner of John G. Mark's addition to the city of Oskaloosa, thence north until it intersects the present boundaries of said city, thence east and south along the present boundary of said city, to the place of commencement.

### Jurisdiction.

- SEC. 2. The jurisdiction and all laws, ordinances and regulations of said city are hereby extended over said territory, and of full force and virtue in the same.
- SEC. 3. This act shall be in force from and after its publication in the Iowa City Republican and Oskaloosa Herald, the expense of publication to be paid by said city of Oskaloosa.
