## CHAPTER 376

## COURT STUDY COMMISSION

## S. J. R. 18

A JOINT RESOLUTION to create an interim commission to study the court system of Iowa with a view to reorganization of the structure to secure the maximum utilization of personnel for the efficient handling of litigation.

## Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- SECTION 1. There is hereby created a commission to consist of thirteen (13) members: three (3) members of the Senate to be appointed by the President of the Senate, three (3) members of the House to be appointed by the Speaker, three (3) members of the Iowa State Bar Association to be appointed by the President of the Iowa State Bar Association, three (3) district court judges and one justice of the Supreme Court to be appointed by the Iowa Supreme Court. The commission shall elect a chairman and such officers from its membership as it deems necessary.
- SEC. 2. The commission shall make a detailed and comprehensive study of the court system of this state concerning the administration, organization and structure of the Iowa court system, redistricting of the judicial districts with particular emphasis on utilization of court personnel, justices of the peace, municipal and superior court systems, and the methods of handling minor litigation. The commission shall report its findings and recommendations to the next regular general assembly.
- SEC. 3. The commission may employ research, office and stenographic assistants and hold meetings and hearings as may be necessary to accomplish the purposes set forth in this resolution.
- SEC. 4. Members of the commission shall be paid their reasonable and necessary travel and subsistence, as incurred by them on vouchers approved by the chairman and secretary of the commission.
  - SEC. 5. There is hereby appropriated from the general fund the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act.
