and inserting in lieu thereof the words "All expenses, except salaries, incurred by the state apiarist or his assistants in the performance of their duties within a county shall be paid not to exceed two hundred (200) dollars per annum from the general fund of such county for the purpose of eradication of diseases among bees. Such work of eradication".

SEC. 8. Chapter one hundred sixty (160), Code 1962, is hereby amended by adding the following new section:

amended by adding the following new section:

"Each colony of bees moved into Iowa from another state by nonresidents of Iowa shall be assessed a fifty (50) cents entry fee. The
fee, together with the certificate of inspection from the state of origin,
shall be collected by the state apiarist who shall forward such fees to
the auditor of the county where the bees are to be located. Only nonresidents of Iowa shall be subject to such entry fee."

AN ACT relating to the importation of swine into Iowa.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- SECTION 1. Section one hundred sixty-three point thirty (163.30), Code 1962, is amended by striking from subsection three (3) line ten
- 3 (10) the word "immunized" and inserting in lieu thereof the words 4 "officially vaccinated".
- Further amend said subsection three (3) by striking from line fourteen (14) the word "immunization" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "official vaccination".
- 8 Further amend said subsection three (3) by striking from line six-

teen (16) the word "immunized" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "officially vaccinated". 10

Said section one hundred sixty-three point thirty (163.30), Code 1962, is further amended by striking the remainder of subsection three (3) beginning with the words "Such health" in line twenty-six

(26) and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

"Such health certificate shall show that the swine have been inspected within forty-eight hours prior to the time of importation, and that they are apparently free of symptoms of infections, contagious or communicable diseases and shall include a record of official vaccination. when applicable. Swine shall not be imported when treated with antihog-cholora serum or antibody concentrate alone.'

Said section one hundred sixty-three point thirty (163.30), Code 1962, is further amended by striking all of subsections four (4), five

(5), six (6) and seven (7) and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

"4. All feeding and breeding swine having been officially vaccinated not less than twenty-one days nor more than one year with modified live virus vaccine, or not less than twenty-one days nor more than six months with killed virus vaccine prior to importation, moved to a livestock market for the purpose of resale, may be exchanged freely provided that such swine are inspected for contagious and infectious diseases by a qualified veterinarian prior to release from such market.

Results of such inspection and proof of official vaccination shall be reported on a certificate supplied by the department and such certificate forwarded immediately to the division of animal industry of the

department of agriculture.

'5. Swine may be imported into Iowa that have been officially vaccinated less than twenty-four hours by a licensed veterinarian with anti-hog-cholera serum or antibody concentrate and modified live virus vaccine, but must be guarantined twenty-one days at the point of destination, but in no case shall such swine be in transit from point of origin to point of destination more than forty-eight hours after vaccination.

"6. Swine may be imported into this state subject to official vaccination upon arrival and held under quarantine twenty-one days from

date of vaccination.

"7. Unvaccinated swine imported to a state-federal approved market may be held up to seventy-two hours after importation, during which time such swine must be officially vaccinated and delivered immediately to the purchaser's premises. All swine held longer than the seventy-two hours period will be subject to twenty-one days quarantine on the market premises.

Proof of official vaccination and quarantine shall be forwarded immediately to the division of animal industry of the department of

agriculture."

Said section one hundred sixty-three point thirty (163.30), Code 1962, is further amended by striking subsections eight (8) and nine (9) and inserting in lieu thereof a paragraph as follows:

"The provisions of this section shall not apply to the intra-state movement of native Iowa swine."
