

9 The governor shall fix his compensation which shall be payable out of the
10 funds of the commission. The director shall not be a member of the com-
11 mission.

12 A director appointed when the general assembly is not in session shall
13 serve at the pleasure of the governor, but his term shall expire thirty days
14 after the general assembly next convenes, unless during such thirty days he
15 be approved by two-thirds of the members of the senate."

16 3. By striking from line eleven (11) the word "commission" and inserting
17 in lieu thereof the word "governor".

1 SEC. 3. Section twenty-eight point four (28.4), Code 1966, is hereby
2 amended by adding the following:

3 "The director, subject to approval by the governor, may employ
4 administrative assistants or deputies."

1 SEC. 4. Chapter ninety-five (95), section three (3), Acts of the Sixty-
2 second General Assembly, is hereby amended as follows:

3 1. By striking from line thirty-nine (39) the word "and".

4 2. By inserting in line forty (40) after the word "each" the words
5 "; and all administrative assistants or deputies employed by the director
6 of the Iowa development commission."

1 SEC. 5. This Act being deemed of immediate importance shall take
2 effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Manson Jour-
3 nal, a newspaper published in Manson, Iowa, and in the Waterloo Daily
4 Courier, a newspaper published in Waterloo, Iowa.

CHAPTER 84

ADMINISTRATIVE STATE AIRCRAFT

S. F. 668

AN ACT to establish a permanent revolving fund in the department of public defense for the
payment of the maintenance and operational costs of administrative state aircraft and to
make an appropriation therefor.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter twenty-nine A (29A), Code 1966, is hereby amend-
2 ed by adding the following new section thereto:

3 "There is hereby appropriated from the general fund of the state to the
4 department of public defense the sum of twenty thousand (20,000) dollars
5 to be used as a permanent revolving fund to pay maintenance and opera-
6 tional costs, including motor overhaul costs, of the administrative state
7 aircraft maintained by the department of public defense for administrative
8 flights of the governor and other state officials. Any of the funds so expend-
9 ed shall be prorated on a usage basis by the department of public defense

10 and this fund shall be reimbursed by the department, agency, bureau,
11 association or institution making use of the aircraft.

12 If any surplus accrues to said revolving fund in excess of the original
13 appropriation for which there is no anticipated need or use, the governor
14 shall order such surplus to be reverted to the general fund.”

CHAPTER 85

HERBERT HOOVER DAY

H. F. 95

AN ACT to designate Herbert Hoover Day as a recognition day.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 SECTION 1. The Sunday which falls on or nearest the tenth day of
2 August of each year is hereby designated as Herbert Hoover Day, which
3 shall be a recognition day in honor of the late President Herbert Hoover.
4 The governor is hereby authorized and requested to issue annually a proc-
5 lamation designating such Sunday as Herbert Hoover Day and calling
6 on the people and officials of the state of Iowa to commemorate the life
7 and principles of Herbert Hoover, to display the American flag, and to hold
8 appropriate services and ceremonies.

CHAPTER 86

LEGAL PUBLIC HOLIDAYS

H. F. 258

AN ACT to provide for uniform annual observances of certain legal public holidays on Mondays, and for other purposes.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 SECTION 1. The following are legal public holidays:
2 1. New Year Day, January first.
3 2. Lincoln's Birthday, February twelfth.
4 3. Washington's Birthday, the third Monday in February.
5 4. Memorial Day, the last Monday in May.
6 5. Independence Day, July fourth.
7 6. Labor Day, the first Monday in September.
8 7. Veterans Day, the fourth Monday in October.
9 8. Thanksgiving Day, the fourth Thursday in November.
10 9. Christmas Day, December twenty-fifth.

1 SEC. 2. Subsection twenty-three (23) of section four point one (4.1),
2 Code 1966, is hereby amended as follows:
