CHAPTER 1069

SCHOOL FOOD SERVICE

S. F. 1400

AN ACT making an appropriation to the department of public instruction to provide school food service assistance for the purpose of participating in certain federal child nutrition programs.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the department of public instruction for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 1974, and ending June 30, 1975 the following amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be used in the manner designated:

1974-75 Fiscal Year

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION FOR SCHOOL FOOD SERVICE ASSISTANCE.

For the purpose of providing assistance to students enrolled in public school districts and nonpublic schools of the state for breakfasts, lunches, and minimal equipment programs, the following amount: _______\$1,350,000

- SEC. 2. The funds appropriated by this Act shall be used as state matching funds for federal programs and shall be disbursed according to federal regulations.
- SEC. 3. Unencumbered funds as of June 30, 1975 shall revert to the general fund of the state as of September 30, 1975.

SEC. 4. Chapter two hundred eighty-three A (283A), Code 1973, is amended by adding the following new section:

NEW SECTION. The authorities in charge of nonpublic schools may operate or provide for the operation of school lunch programs in schools under their jurisdiction and may use funds appropriated to them by the general assembly, gifts, funds received from sale of school lunches under such programs, and any other funds available to the nonpublic school. However, school lunch programs shall not be required in nonpublic schools. The department of public instruction shall direct the disbursement of state funds to nonpublic schools for school lunch programs in the same manner as state funds are disbursed to public schools.
