CHAPTER 16.

DUBUQUE CHARTER.

AN ACT to repeal an act entitled an act revising and consolidating the laws incorporaling the City of Dubuque, and to establish a City Court therein.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa, That chapter 210 of the acts passed at the regular session of the General Assembly, begun and held at Iowa City on the first day of December, A. D. 1856, approved January 28th, 1857, be and the same is hereby repealed.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication one time in each of the following named newspapers to wit: Express and Herald, Tribune and National Demokrat, published in the city of Dubuque, and it is hereby made the duty of the Secretary of State to have such publication made without delay.

CHAPTER 17.

SCHOOL OFFICERS.

AN ACT to legalize the acts of certain School Officers.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa, That all School Districts organized after July 4th, 1857, under the provisions of Chapter 158 of the laws of the Sixth General Assembly of the State of Iowa, be and the same are hereby declared legal so far as relates to the time of organization and the election of school officers.
