CHAPTER 57.

J. D. EADS.

AN ACT for the appointment of a Commissioner to settle with the sureties of J. D. Eads.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa, That his Excellency, the Govern-Govern to settle with sureties of J. D. Eads, late Superintendent of Public Instruction, permitting said sureties to make an equitable apportionment among themselves of their liability, and securing the same by note and mortgage on five or eight years time, paying interest annually, in like manner as other loans of the School Fund are required to be paid, or upon such other terms as shall best promote the interests of the State.

SEC. 2. The acts of said Commissioner relative to the School Fund or the pecuniary interests of the State Pub. Inst. ap. shall not be binding in law without the approval of the proval.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Tri-Weekly Citizen and Tri-Weekly Iowa State Journal.
