d. The board shall adopt rules prohibiting the owner, publisher, or editor of a sham newspaper from using the sham newspaper to promote in any way the candidacy of such a person for any public office. As used in this paragraph, "sham newspaper" means a newspaper that does not meet the requirements set forth in section 618.3 and "owner" means a person having an ownership interest exceeding ten percent of the equity or profits of the newspaper.

CHAPTER 62

LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY ELECTRONIC MAIL AND TELEPHONE BILLING RECORDS

S.F. 140

AN ACT relating to the time period for which peace officers' investigative reports and specific portions of electronic mail and telephone billing records are to be kept confidential.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

Section 1. Section 22.7, subsection 5, Code 2007, is amended to read as follows:

5. Peace officers' investigative reports, and specific portions of electronic mail and telephone billing records of law enforcement agencies if that information is part of an ongoing investigation, except where disclosure is authorized elsewhere in this Code. However, the date, time, specific location, and immediate facts and circumstances surrounding a crime or incident shall not be kept confidential under this section, except in those unusual circumstances where disclosure would plainly and seriously jeopardize an investigation or pose a clear and present danger to the safety of an individual. Specific portions of electronic mail and telephone billing records may <u>only</u> be kept confidential under this subsection <u>only for as long as if the length of time prescribed for commencement of prosecution or the finding of an indictment or information under the statute of limitations would have run on a respective applicable to the crime that is under investigation <u>has not expired</u>.</u>
